UMCOR Relief for 2024 Hurricanes

Hurricane Helene has devastated parts of the southeastern U.S., bringing catastrophic wind, rain and flash flooding to many states and communities. In response, UMCOR is coordinating with affected annual conferences and supporting their local relief efforts. So far, UMCOR has awarded solidarity grants to the North Georgia, South Georgia, Western North Carolina and Holston annual conferences. Additionally, UMCOR-trained Early Response Teams (ERTs) are coordinating efforts to support the removal of debris, tarping of roofs, and cleaning out of homes in hard-hit areas.

Both Helene and Milton hit Florida. As countless families and communities face the overwhelming aftermath of these storms, UMCOR is supporting the efforts of conference disaster response ministries across the region. Cleaning and hygiene kits are being delivered. Early Response Teams are removing debris, tarping roofs and cleaning homes. Pray for all those impacted by this disaster, as well as first responders and volunteers. The road to recovery will be long, but together, we can bring hope and healing




Mission and Outreach 20%





Thankfulness in All Seasons

As we approach this season of Thanksgiving, we are reminded of the power and necessity of gratitude toward God—not only because He is worthy of our thanks, but because our thankfulness keeps us mindful of God's constant provision. Scripture tells us that every good gift, all wisdom, and every understanding come from Him, our ultimate Provider.

In his epistle to the Thessalonians, Paul encourages us to "pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:17-18). This isn't a call to celebrate every hardship, but to find a deeper faith in God's presence through them. Joseph, one of the great heroes of our faith, faced betrayal, slavery, and imprisonment. Yet, through these trials, God worked to prepare him to help multitudes survive a prolonged famine, including the very family that had betrayed him. 

Reading Circle Discussion Book for Nov. 14

It has been author Marie Benedict's quest to bring history's most fascinating and courageous women to life for contemporary readers. In our November discussion book, The Personal Librarian, Benedict and co-author Victoria Christopher Murray relate the remarkable, littleknown story of Belle da Costa Greene, J. P. Morgan's personal librarian-who became one of the most powerful women in New York despite the dangerous secret she kept in order to make her dreams come true. In her twenties, Belle da Costa Greene is hired by J. Pierpont Morgan to curate a collection of rare manuscripts, books, and artwork for his newly built Morgan Library. Belle becomes a fixture on the New York society scene and one of the most powerful people in the art and book world, known for her impeccable taste and shrewd negotiating for critical works as she helps build a world-class collection. But Belle has a secret, one she must protect at all costs. She was born not Belle da Costa Greene but Belle Marion Greener. She is the daughter of Richard Greener, the first Black graduate of Harvard and well-known advocate for equality. Belle's complexion isn't dark because of her alleged Portuguese heritage that lets her pass as white — her complexion is dark because she is African American. The Personal Librarian tells the story of an extraordinary woman, famous for her intellect, style, and wit, and shares the lengths she must go-for the protection of her family and her legacy-to preserve her carefully crafted white identity in the racist world in which she lives.

Wait (and Work) for Your "Wyatt"

Some of you may recall, I only asked for one thing the Sunday before our recent trip to Alaska. Of course, I asked for traveling "mercies," safe, on-time driving and flights, no lost luggage, etc. But then I asked for God to show me the Glory of His creation. And, Oh Boy, did He oblige! I had to wait a while, though, work for it a little (including getting a bit "messy"), then wait some more before God showed His Glory, in one of His Glorious creatures that this "city kid" had never seen before.

The first thing we did when we got on the ship was book our excursions. The first one wouldn't be for 24 hours. I could hardly contain my enthusiasm! I must have sounded like the 3-year olds I used to sing the song with, telling everyone: "I'm going on a Bear Hunt!" (I wasn't going to "shoot" one with anything but my phone's camera, but I was definitely looking for one.)

But first came the waiting. After 24 hours on the ship, there was another hour or so on a tour boat. Then came the "work," nearly a mile walk down a path through the woods (about the top end of what I can handle at one time). There was even a bit of "mess" when I stepped in some "bear skat" along the way.

Then we arrived at the Salmon Hatchery. When you're looking for a predator, you go where their favorite prey are. Then we waited some more. We could only stay there 30 minutes and we spent 20 watching the salmon swimming in the reservoir and admiring the "waterfall" created by the reservoir runoff.

Then, there he was —a magnificent black bear, probably 9 feet or so from his head to hind end, weighing at least 800 pounds. Mostly he had his head in the water, fishing for salmon. He must have noticed us staring, though, because at one point he stood upright on his back legs and puffed his chest at us as if to say: "Admire all you want, just remember, I'm in charge!" That's when one guide called out to the other: "Hey, It's Wyatt!" They had to report sightings, new or recurrent, so the guides give them names, and this one had a white "Y"-shaped streak on the center of his chest. It was an amazing experience!

How about you?! Are you asking God to show you His Power and Glory?! Maybe you need healing in your physical or mental health, finances or relationships. Be prepared to wait, and then wait some more. If God leads you to, there may be work you need to do, and it may get a little "messy." But, in His own way and time (He's in charge), God will give you your own "Wyatt" experience.
