

Do you remember what happened on January 15, 2009, on the Hudson River in New York? As you may know, on that day, US Airways Flight 1549 faced a very dangerous situation. Shortly after takeoff, both engines failed. However, the captain of the flight, Chesley Sullenberger, managed to land the plane safely on the Hudson River, saving all 155 passengers. The media called this event the "Miracle on the Hudson."

According to aviation experts, such engine failure is typically catastrophic. In most cases, when both engines fail midair, it leads to tragedy, often with no survivors. Yet in this instance, no one was hurt, and all their lives were saved.

What made this miracle possible? One of the key reasons was Captain Chesley Sullenberger's seasoned ability to handle the crisis. He was an experienced pilot with over 19,000 flight hours. His extensive practice and training equipped him to stay calm and navigate this life-threatening situation with confidence and skill.

I believe our life journey requires a similar approach. When we face tough and unexpected situations, how we respond depends on how well we've trained and prepared ourselves.

In 2025, we will undoubtedly encounter challenges and difficulties. These are an inevitable part of life. But as Christians, we have a unique source of strength. Those who have disciplined themselves spiritually—through prayer, reading the Bible, participating in small groups, worshiping God, and serving others—are better equipped to handle life's challenges. Just as Captain Sullenberger safely landed his flight, we too can navigate life's trials when we walk closely with God and rely on His care.

As we begin this new year, let's commit to investing in our spiritual disciplines. Let us pray more, study Scripture, gather in fellowship, worship wholeheartedly, and care for our neighbors. These practices strengthen our faith and prepare us for whatever lies ahead.

### New Beginnings: Moving Forward in Faith

As we enter a new year, we see it as a chance for new beginnings. But moving forward often means letting go letting go of disappointments, mistakes, or circumstances that threaten to keep us stuck. Jesus compared this to a man plowing a field: once he sets out, looking back will only veer him off course. We can't walk toward the future while focusing on what's behind us. We must commit to moving forward.

Life brings challenges, and how we face them says a lot about us. But how we face them in faith shows us who God is. The Bible reminds us, "If anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come" (2 Corinthians 5:17). Christ came to give His life for our sin, but He rose again to bring us newness of life. Through Him, we can start fresh, no matter what has come before.

God uses circumstances to shape us, not break us. While we often ask Him to change what's around us, the real work begins on the inside—renewing our hearts, strengthening our trust, and giving us a new perspective.

New beginnings aren't just about what happens *to* us—they're about what happens *in* us. When we trust God and move forward in faith, we become living examples of His grace, hope, and power to make *all* things new. Jesus Revolution is the story of one young hippie's quest in the 1970s for belonging and liberation that leads not only to peace, love, and rock and roll, but that sets into motion a new counterculture crusade — a Jesus Movement — changing the course of history. Inspired by a true movement, this recounts the story of a young Greg Laurie being raised by his struggling mother, Charlene, in the 1970s. Laurie and a sea of young people descend on sunny Southern California to redefine truth through all means of liberation. Inadvertently, Laurie meets Lonnie Frisbee a charismatic hippie-street-preacher, and Pastor Chuck Smith who have thrown open the doors of Smith's languishing church to a stream of wandering youth. What unfolds becomes the greatest spiritual awakening in American history. Rock and roll, newfound love, and a twist of faith lead to a Jesus Revolution that turns one counterculture movement into a revival that changes the world.



# **IMPORTANT: Building Security During Meetings**

The Aldersgate Council is asking everyone to be proactive in securing the building against outside dangers once meetings begin (i.e., locking the doors), especially for night-time meetings. This will require some changes in our thinking and actions from our current process. Based on increasingly common threats and dangers that are occurring against organizations and people in organizations, including churches, it seems sensible to be proactive in taking necessary steps to protect people attending meetings in the AUMC facilities.

In fact, the Trustees report that some of the non-Aldersgate groups that meet in our facilities have already instituted this policy for their meetings. To accommodate late arrivals to meetings they have set up various procedures: a designated cell phone to call, a knock on the window of the IDE Center, and even a mobile remote doorbell set up for one group. The Trustees are currently investigating some inexpensive options that will help facilitate this new security process for Aldersgate meetings.

So please consider this new program for your group, and brainstorm how this safety program will be implemented in your committee or group for your safety.



### Test Me In This...

"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse...'Test Me in this,' says the Lord, 'and see if I will not throw open floodgates of Heaven and pour forth such a blessing that you cannot contain it." (Micah 3:10)

One of my favorite Biblical figures and Bible stories, is Gideon and the story of Gideon and the fleece. (Judges 6:25-40) I am, and have been, the one hearing from God and saying, "Prove it's really You, God, saying this and prove that it's really going to work." In this case, though, God's law is similar to the laws of nature. If you want to know if something will work, you have to take that step and try it out, and give it some time to get proven.

Like with my 'getting saved' story, I don't remember the exact start of my tithing journey. It was about 18 years ago, at a time when we were pretty broke most of the time. Knowing the way I think (and many people think), it was probably a matter of: "OK, God, I've tried everything else, let me try it Your way and see what You do with it." And what He's done with it has been pretty amazing!

Let me start, though, with what He didn't do. He didn't make me a millionaire! Don't let the idea of opening floodgates fool you. Then again, that wouldn't necessarily be good either. All those places, recently, saying: "We got a year's worth of rain in a weekend were not saying that in a good way! He has opened up with enough of a steady 'drizzle' that, even in the hardest times, I've had less experience of "lack" than before I started tithing.



And every time, even if it wasn't with immediate new income, He gave me a way out of that lack.

It has made me a better money "manager." I love a line I heard about tithing and the anxiety folks have about it: "It's not the giving of 10% that puts you in debt, it's what you do with the other 90%!" Your priorities have to shift. You give to God first, then the bills and other essentials, before you splurge on the 'wants.' But isn't that what living like Christ is all about anyway?!

Lastly, not that that's the reason for doing it, but it feels really Good! Even if, like mine, your individual tithe doesn't seem like much; when you look back at the end of a year, you stand amazed at what God has done through you!

So, as we begin/continue our journey into this new year, be like Gideon. Test God! Ask Him to prove that He will sustain You and bless you (in SO many ways), and then do your part of the equation by beginning, or continuing "true tithing." If you truly commit to it, and to changing your priorities, you will never regret it!
