From the Pastor

During our Saturday morning prayer meetings, I have read several books together with the prayer team members. For our next book, we took time to share and recommend titles that might be meaningful for the group. One member suggested *The Purpose Driven Life* by Pastor Rick Warren. As you may know, this book was a well-known and even global bestseller some years ago. Of course, I had read it before, and I believe many of you have also read it and received helpful insights for your journey of faith.

Now, we are reading it again, and as we share reflections together, certain messages have stood out to us. For this month's pastoral letter, I would like to share something that truly touched our group during one Saturday morning. It comes from Day 3, titled "What Drives Your Life?"

As we all know, every life is driven by something. Pastor Warren names five common things that drive people: **guilt, resentment and anger, fear, materialism, and the need for approval.** That is, many people are driven by guilt. Many people are driven by resentment and anger. Many people are driven by fear. Many people are driven by materialism. And many people are driven by the need for approval.

Let us pause for a moment and ask ourselves: "What drives my life?" Perhaps one or more of these has been shaping our path in ways we hadn't noticed.

But this is also a moment to pause, reflect, and realign our purpose — the purpose God has given us for a life that is full, meaningful, and joyful, much like turning our hearts back toward true north before continuing our walk of faith.

Why don't we take a moment to remember a Bible passage? Ephesians 5:17 says, "Don't live carelessly, unthinkingly. Make sure you understand what the Master wants."

THIS OLD ROOF! — Project Update

The Finance/Stewardship teams designated April as a funding drive to raise an additional \$19,000 to be able to fully finance the replacement of the section of roof over the Parlor/bathrooms/hallway in the oldest part of the church. **During the 4 weeks of April we raised \$11,598.** This is a fantastic response and we are truly grateful for all the support. Thank you to everyone who supported this effort!

Now, you might be thinking that since we didn't raise the entire \$19,000, "How are we going to pay for the entire job?" The short answer is that we are going to borrow the remainder of what we need from the reserve of the Mortgage fund.

The longer answer is that in addition to the funding drive, we have also applied for a Fred and Floy Willmott Foundation grant. Besides the replacement for the roof, the Trustees have also identified other crucial capital repairs/replacements for the church including (in order of priority):

- repaying the Mortgage fund what was borrowed to replace the roof
- replacing the window in the Parlor
- repairing the masonry outside of the Parlor window and repairing the wall next to that window
- replacing all the lights in the IDE Center with LED lights to lower electricity usage and increase longevity
- replacing the 20-year-old boiler. This past winter, much work was spent keeping the boiler functional and at this point it's nearing the end of its service life.

We feel confident that the church will be awarded some (if not all) of the funds we have asked for and will use the funds in order of priority. If there are extra funds left over they will be kept in the Capital Improvement Fund to be used for other needed repairs in the future. Stay tuned for more updates as they come!

A Note From Our New, Incoming Pastor

As your incoming pastor, I want to introduce myself. I am the Rev. Dr. Wilson Jones but you can call me Pastor Wilson. I have been serving churches for 28 years. Originally ordained in The Wesleyan Church in 1998, I became an elder in the UMC in 2000. I graduated from Houghton College and Asbury Theological Seminary but my journey has taken me many places since then. In addition, I hold a Doctor of Ministry in Worship, Spirituality, and Preaching from Drew University. I am trained in Conflict Transformation and Mediation and have worked coaching church leaders and individuals about how to manage oneself in the systems of which we are a part (as an example, I titled one workshop “How to Keep Your Head When Everyone Around You is Losing Theirs”). I will also let you know I have a rather quirky sense of humor. But you all will find that out soon enough.

Before becoming a pastor, I worked in the insurance industry. I have been married to Alyson for almost 35 years. We have 3 adult children. The oldest, Kelsea, lives in Prague, Czech Republic and is completing a PhD in Chemistry. Our middle child, Kendra, lives in Canandaigua and works at Nolan’s on the Lake restaurant. Jacob, the youngest, is a junior at Brockport majoring in Sport Management and minoring in Public Relations. Ally and I are avid hikers and baseball fans (Blue Jays and Mets, respectively). I enjoy golf, bowling, British television and most outdoor activities. My favorite scripture passage is “*Then the one seated on the throne said, ‘Look! I’m making all things new.’*” (Rev. 21:5). This scripture reminds me that God is at work everywhere and always in the act of re-creation...even when we might have trouble seeing it. I look forward to beginning ministry together and am excited to see what God is doing in your midst.

Devotional: She Loved Well

Genesis 1:26-28 “...Subdue the earth...Have dominion over every living thing...”

I want to explain the old-fashioned, Old Testament (King James) words. Subduing the earth doesn’t mean tearing it up and taking from it. It means gently caring for it and using it as God intended. And having dominion over animals and people doesn’t mean treating them harshly or ignoring them. It means caring for their needs. And one person who understood that very well was Carol.

So many of you took Carol into your hearts and prayers — as if she were your own sister or sister-in-law (and I can’t Thank You all enough for that) — I decided to do a tribute so that you know who she was before the TBI and the heart attack.

Carol was born in mid-July 1953, the eldest of 4, with my husband being her “baby” brother. There were three “sets” of living things Carol loved most — her entire family (her Mom, siblings and, especially, her husband and one son), her Golden Retrievers (never fewer than 3, sometimes as many as 8) and her garden (mostly herbs for cooking).

Carol was an “older” Mom and Jeff was her long-awaited treasure! She cherished him and gave him everything, but also gave him the “wings” to leave home when he was ready.

Being the eldest, Carol — even more so than their Mom — kept in contact with everyone, offering emotional support, advice, even occasional financial aid when needed. Those phone calls every couple of weeks are what have been, and will continue to be, the most sorely missed.

Carol and her late husband raised, bred and showed (more endurance and exercise than “primping and strutting”) Golden Retrievers. The younger and stronger spent most of their time in the finished basement with lots of human attention, while 2 or 3 old, sick or very pregnant were always up in the main part of the house.

And Carol carefully tilled, planted, watered and nurtured her herb garden, and brought cuttings into a small box garden in her kitchen window, so she had basil, oregano and other herbs in reach for her cooking.

We are told many places in the Bible to love one another. And, considering the verses in Genesis, I’m certain God would include animals and plants in that command too. I think there can be no better tribute at the end of one’s earthly life than to say they loved well. And Carol loved VERY well!

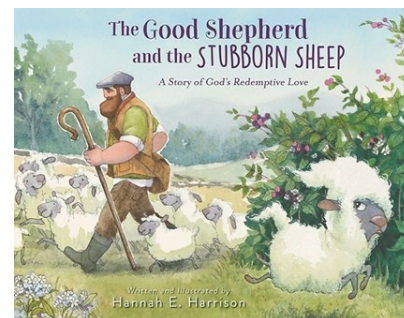

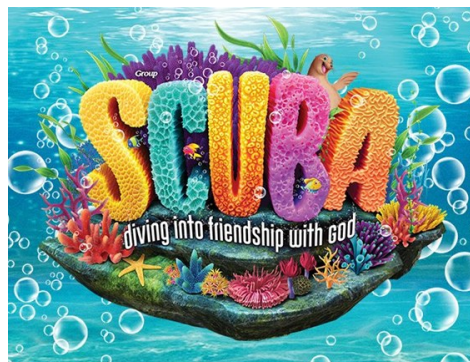

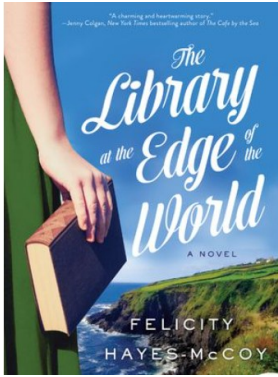
