July Devotional: Shoveling Dirt Upside-Down

"Behold, I am doing a new thing..." Isaiah 43:19

Please bear with one more "Carol" story, only this is of her funeral/burial. Carol's late husband was Jewish and they are buried together at a Jewish cemetery. At a Jewish burial, you wait while the casket is lowered and, if you wish to participate, then drop a few shovels full of dirt into the grave. There is one difference in the Jewish tradition, though. You start by dropping the first couple of shovels-full upside-down! The rabbi explained that this was to acknowledge and admit that this did not feel "right" or "normal." Losing someone never does and acknowledging that is the first step toward a "new normal."

We, at Aldersgate church are going through another "loss" of a pastor. Seeing Pastor Yohang and Joyce had become "normal," and seeing someone new will seem "not normal." Through my "not normal" experience of shoveling dirt upside-down, I gained some insights that I think will help us to hasten the "new-normal" feeling with Pastor Wilson and his family.

The first is to participate. Engage Pastor Wilson in conversation. Tell him your "story." Spend time getting to know him and letting him get to know you. You will be the richer for it.

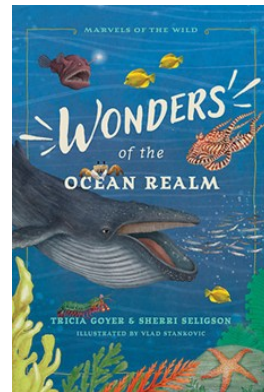

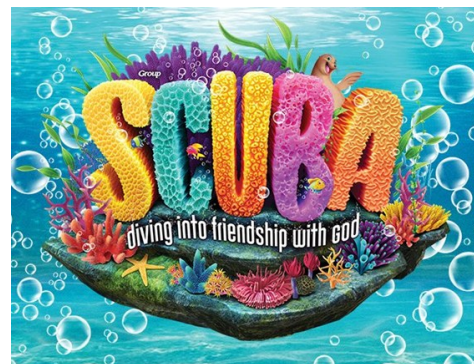

Annual Conference Report

The theme for the 2025 Annual Conference of the United Methodists of Upper New York was: *“Believe and see the Glory of God,”* from **Luke 11:40** in the Biblical story of Jesus raising Lazarus back to life. And I experienced some of that before even arriving. I made “wrong turns” coming off the highway, but they led me to the thing I really needed at that moment and then, with a clearer head, I got to my destination refreshed and ready!

These are changing times for our Conference and nearby Conferences, truly an opportunity to walk by faith and watch God work. Our 12 districts are now led by 6 District Superintendents, and our Upper NY Annual Conference is now joined with Susquehanna Conference in terms of being led by one Bishop, **Hector Burgos Nunez**. (Just as I hope you have been for our **Pastor Yohang** and are now for **Pastor Wilson**, keep our incoming District Superintendent, **Rockelle Goff** and **Bishop Hector** in your constant prayers.) We, as a Church Conference will come through this stronger; things will just look different.

But different is OK. With it being our theme, I looked again at the story of Lazarus. Yes, Jesus brought him back to life, but first Jesus had to let Lazarus die so that He could bring him back stronger. We, as church leaders — at our local church level as well as those at the district and Conference level — have to examine how we ‘do church’ and “decide what we are willing to let die” in order to bring it back different but stronger.

That quote actually came from a different, but related, topic. Our Keynote speakers, **Chris Sledge** and **Rachel Gilmore**, the authors of *“Faithful Under 40,”* spoke on how our young adults are Faith-filled and “spiritual” but that, unless we shift both how and maybe even where we do church, we will not bring them back in. And they showed some statistics of how ‘aging’ our church populations are; we need to bring them back in!

The Memorial Service speaker, **Rev. Mike Wheaton**, talked about sometimes “walking backwards,” moving forward while looking back, not dwelling on the past but seeing what God brought our deceased loved ones, the founders of our denomination and our Biblical heroes through, and gaining strength in knowing that we trust in the same God!

And, last but not least, perhaps a testament to the Glory of God, even in these changing times, the budget was passed with a small increase in Pastor’s salaries but NO increase in apportionments.

The next is to have patience, both with yourself and with Pastor Wilson and his family. I learned that quickly with the upside-down shovel. If I tried to move too quickly, the dirt would fall right off. I had to be slow and deliberate. And we will need to be deliberate about using name tags and other things, that the transition team asks of us, in order to hasten the “new normal” feeling. And we, especially, need to be patient with Pastor Wilson. We have two new people coming, with mini-bios we’ve already had a chance to read. They have 100 or so of us, with life stories they won’t know until we tell them.

And, lastly, come with an expectation of both learning from and enjoying fellowship with Pastor Wilson and his family. When a Pastor prepares to leave, we remember the things they’ve taught us and the laughter, and tears, that we’ve shared and think that we won’t learn from, or enjoy fellowship with the next one as much. But, with all the transfers I’ve been part of, I’ve found that I’ve learned as much, if not more, from the new pastor and enjoyed the same sweet fellowship with them.

So, while you’re doing your gardening, in these early summer days, or just putting sugar in your coffee, try turning the shovel (or spoon) upside-down. Let that experience remind you of the extra dose of patience and diligence God wants us to exercise during this transition period, and in our everyday lives.
