From the Pastor

Things are changing. The leaves are full of color. The temperature is dropping. The days are shorter. We know from these signs that Fall is upon us and the yearly cycle of nature is nearly over. The move from Fall to Winter means a new cycle is beginning. And we know that winter will eventually give way to longer days, greener landscapes and the beauty of God's gardens.

There is also a changing of the seasons in the church. We began the cycle last December 1 on the 1st Sunday of Advent by looking forward with hope to the second coming of Christ as we prepared for celebrating the birth of Jesus. From there we moved through Christmas and Epiphany before, after a brief breath, we made the journey through Lent, Holy Week, Easter and Pentecost. I am thankful for the Christian Year. I grew up in a church that made a big deal about Christmas and Easter but barely recognized the other important feasts and seasons on the church calendar.

I often hear folks express astonishment about how early retailers begin selling merchandise for the next holiday: Halloween stuff on the shelves shortly after Labor Day and Thanksgiving items before Halloween. I was told this week that someone saw candy canes at Wegmans...AND IT ISN'T EVEN HALLOWEEN YET!!!! And sometimes I hear Christians complain about the commercialization of the "church" holidays like Christmas and Easter.

The value, for me, of the Christian Year is that it provides an antidote to how our society has distorted these important feasts. With Christmas decorations already adorning the shelves, the Christian calendar says, "Wait! Advent comes first." When Easter bunnies are already appearing in our neighbors' yards, the Church year says, "Wait! We haven't done Lent yet."

Patience is one of the fruits of the Spirit. We live in a world of instance gratification. We live in a world that wants the gain without the pain. The Christian faith is full of joy and praise and hope. But it is also a life of sacrifice and waiting and wondering. I am glad we follow the Christian year in church because it makes sure that I experience the full breadth of what it means to be a part of God's people in worship (and hopefully, in life). Maybe you don't need

And the following week we will begin the journey all over again on the 1st Sunday of Advent. May the next year be one of growth and grace and discipleship as we travel together.


Join Us for a Church History Brunch, Nov. 8



November 16th is also Commitment Sunday, when each of us has an opportunity to make a pledge of Estimated Giving to the church for 2026. Pledge cards will be mailed to those on our mailing list the week of November 3rd. If you don't receive a pledge card in the mail, they will be available in the November 16th Bulletin, in the Mid-Week moments, or by contacting the church office. Please consider how you can support Aldersgate church in 2026 so we can continue to thrive in order to joyfully receive God's blessings, Manage his blessings, and Share those blessings with others now and in the future.

Mortgage Pay-Off is Near!

It will also be an opportunity for many of you who are newer to Aldersgate to help us to pay off the mortgage debt we took on in 2006 to build our beautiful Sanctuary, Gathering Space, IDE Center, and offices of the church. At this point, it is only a 5-month commitment as the goal is to be paid off on June 1, 2026. As of January 1st, we will owe approximately \$52,500, but current estimates have us short the funds we need to be able to pay the remaining monthly mortgage payments. Can you help with an extra donation either weekly, monthly or a one-time gift to get our church to the 'finish line' and relieve us of this debt by June 1st? There will be a place to put your short commitment on the Pledge card for 2026.

SPRC Notes

Clarifying the Pastor's Time Off

The Staff-Parish Relations Committee will sometimes hear from someone who wonders how much time off the pastor gets each year (usually preceded by "Is he gone again?"). So we wanted to communicate how much time away Pastor Wilson is afforded each year. The following is from the Upper New York Annual Conference Clergy Support Policy for 2026:

- All clergy are eligible for two days off per week for personal time, family time and spiritual renewal; one of which would be a Sabbath day.
- Full-time Clergy are eligible for 4 weeks of vacation each year with 5 weeks for those with more than 20 years of full-time equivalent service. The number of Sundays off will correspond at least one-to-one with the number of weeks of vacation.
- As per ¶ 351.1 & 351.2 (in the Book of Discipline), full-time clergy shall have at least 1 week per year of Continuing Education/Spiritual Growth Leave, with the Conference providing up to one more additional week for a total of up to 2 weeks. Furthermore, once every quadrennial period (every four years) there should be one year where an additional month of Continuing Education/Spiritual Growth is undertaken.

In addition, Pastor Wilson has been appointed by the Bishop to the Board of Ordained Ministry, a group of 40 pastors and lay people of the Annual Conference. The BOM is responsible for identifying, supporting, and credentialing candidates and clergy. Their work includes recommending individuals for licensing and ordination, establishing standards for ongoing formation, and conducting regular evaluations. Its meetings require his presence in Syracuse at various times during the year, occasionally on a Sunday.

Thanksgiving is a blessing, one I give to you. My thanks for what you've given so my dreams can all come true.

From sunrise to sunset, a community journeys through a Thanksgiving day, bringing together offerings of family, friendship, tradition, and love. 
Thank you to everyone who baked, bought, and supported our Fall Bake Sale! We raised \$220 to support upcoming Children's Ministry events here at Aldersgate.


