Live a Life of Faith — February 2026

From the Pastor

What are you giving up for Lent?" That question was asked a lot of me when I was growing up. For a Baptist kid, (yes, I was Baptist), giving up something for Lent was one of those things that Roman Catholics did.

But it is also common for United Methodists to fast during Lent and we are encouraged to engage in the other traditional Lenten disciplines of prayer and almsgiving as well.

"Lent" comes from an old word, lencten, which meant simply "spring" (and you thought it had some great spiritual significance, didn't you?) and is considered a time of spiritual preparation for Easter. It was first a time when folks were prepared to be baptized on Easter but has developed into a time of entering into the wilderness with Jesus - a time of scarcity and sacrifice and discipline that precedes a time of great and joyful celebration at Easter.

Christians are encouraged to use Lent as a time of deliberate, intense discipleship. And I have noticed that if someone is going to be "spiritual" in their life, it often happens during Lent. Even folks who don't fast or pray or give at other times, often do so during Lent.

As I write this, I look out the window and see a white blanket covering everything (with much more snow on the way). I remember one winter seeing something green poke up through the snow at one of our parsonages. I brushed the snow away and found what I was told were grape hyacinths. In the dead of winter, there was life. Only it was covered. I think of that as a metaphor for Lent.


We all have the Spirit of God within us – what a friend calls the "Holy Aliveness". Sometimes that Life gets buried under the stuff of life. Lent is an opportunity to brush aside the snow, if you will, so that the God's Holy Aliveness can be visible in us. And in keeping with the metaphor, as we move from Lent into Easter, that Life can blossom into a full and glorious bouquet of joy and praise at the wonderful news of our Lord's Resurrection!

God has given us ways to help the Life within us be more visible.

John Wesley called them "means of grace". This Lent I will be preaching a series on some of these means of grace. The series will start on February 22 with a sermon on fasting (when was the last time you heard a sermon on fasting....lol) and will cover Communion, prayer, the Word, and anointing for healing. More information will be found in upcoming Midweek Moments.

May this Lent be a time when we all come to know that truth that "God is the one who enables you both to want and to actually live out his good purposes." (Philippians 3:13 – CEB) Be well!






High School Sunday School


Yarn & Darn — February 3

EBENEZER HOPE MINISTRIES BUILDING PROJECT



An update to the school building project supported by Ebenezer Hope Ministries International [EHM]. Recently I reported to you that there are 180 students already attending school, with sufficient paying students to fund the operation for the refugee students. Remember that after the two class room buildings, with a total of 10 class rooms, were completed the engineers suspended building construction to create a drainage system for the EHM school campus to remove the large amounts of water that collected during the rainy season. A couple of walkways were then built over the drainage ditch so the children could safely cross. The drainage is 2 to 3 feet deep and about 2 feet wide to handle all the rain water that floods the school area, and a few hundred yards long in order to move this rain water off of the school campus. Since there are no power tools available for the Nakivale Refugee Settlement, the digging was all by hand - pick axe & shovel - to remove the tightly packed sandy soil. The ditch stone linings were then cemented in place with hand mixed cement. This is an example of the commitment the refugees have toward building this school campus. They understand how valuable an education is.

Now that the pictured drainage is complete we are moving towards continuing on with constructing buildings, starting with the canteen. In order to fund the rest of the construction we are asking each family to donate an amount equal to

their previous annual support. In a number of cases this would be the amount you donated for a scholarship when we supported students who in the past had to go to the outside EHM school. Please indicate that your donations are for the "African School Project".
