Dear Aldersgate Family:

With September, it means "back to school" for many (students & teachers). This means new challenges for both. In light of that, I'd like to share with you an appropriate story entitled:

A Teacher's Expectations

After being interviewed by the school administration, the teaching prospect said, "Let me see if I've got this right: You want me to go into that room with all those kids, correct their disruptive behavior, observe them for signs of abuse, monitor their dress habits, censor their Tshirt messages, and instill in them a love for learning. You want me to check their backpacks for weapons, wage war on drugs and sexually transmitted diseases, and raise their sense of self esteem and personal pride.

You want me to do all this and then you tell me....

....I CAN'T PRAY?!"

Let's all pray for our teachers and students since they can only pray the "silent" kind.

Bible Experience Stations

We will begin using Cokesbury curriculum for the fall. After a gathering time in the Parlor the children will move from station to station each week. Classes will be 45 to 50 minutes. There are eight stations in all: art, cookery, computers, games, science, music, story and movies. We will start with two stations.

Our young people will be divided into groups (much like in VBS). For Session 1 (Arts and Cookery), one half of the group will go to Art the other will go to Cookery. The following groups will switch to Cookery and Art.



CHURCHES IN NEW ORLEANS NEED TO BE REBUILT, TOO! The millions of dollars raised by United Methodists so far have been used to rebuild homes in hurricane-stricken areas (not just New Orleans). Now it's time to rebuild churches. We took a special offering in church on August 31, but you may still, of course, make a donation to this important cause. Your check written payable to *Aldersgate UMC* marked for "Rebuilding Churches" or your gift in a pew envelope so marked will go directly for that purpose. Please be generous. We will hear more about this need on October 12, when the Rev. Darryl Tate, Executive Director of Recovery Ministry for the Louisiana Conference will be with us for an evening potluck supper. Remember also that we are planning another mission trip to New Orleans for February 14-22. We can build connections while we help to rebuild churches.

Responding to this call often requires a considerable personal sacrifice. DRIVERS NEEDED FOR GREECE FOOD SHELF

According to a recent Greece Post article, the Greece Food Shelf has been receiving more calls for help and needs additional drivers willing to make deliveries. Drivers usually make three deliveries in a month and are normally called upon to serve just four months of the year. However, about 30 drivers delivered food to 120 families in July, and those staffing the food shelf expect to receive about 140 calls in September. Drivers are given boxes of nonperishable food items and money to purchase basic fresh foods for each family. Daytime drivers are especially needed.

Along with more deliveries is a need for more food. In addition to our special "Brown Bag Sundays," we continue to collect nonperishable food supplies for the Greece Food Shelf on a regular basis. COOKSON HILLS CAPITAL CAMPAIGN FOR NEW MINISTRY CENTER

Meri Whitaker, our covenant relationship missionary, has written that the Cookson Hills Center is planning to expand to meet the needs in that rural, very needy, part of Oklahoma. The Mission Center Board has authorized a \$600,000 capital campaign to raise funds to build a 6000 sq. ft. building to house a reception center to receive families; a food pantry, school supplies, thrift store. and layette center; and a computer lab, youth activities area, and a reading center; and some staff offices. The most recently completed building houses the senior center and the child care facilities.

The Cookson Hills Center serves mostly Native Americans, primarily members of the Cherokee tribe. While some assistance is available through their own tribes, other church and government help is needed. To people who are often isolated, poverty-stricken, and poorly educated, Cookson Hills offers social, educational, physical, and spiritual services. The church is truly responding to the needs there of the "least of these."

BUILDING CONNECTIONS
