## FROM THE PASTOR OF VISITATION AND MEMBERSHIP CARE

Dear Aldersgate Family:

As I write my note for the new Hinge, I'm reading and hearing about the miraculous rescue of all the people on the plane that crashed in the Hudson River. The stories tell of how inter-dependent all were who were rescued.

All their stories remind me anew of how each of us is dependent on another in our church family. This is illustrated by the story:

Who Packs Your Parachute?
Sometimes in the daily challenges that life gives us, we miss what is really important. We may fail to say hello, please or thank you, give a compliment, or just do something nice for no reason.

Charlie Plumb, a US Naval Academy graduate, was a jet fighter pilot in Vietnam. After 75 combat missions, his plane was destroyed by a surface-to-air missile. Plumb ejected and parachuted into enemy hands. He was captured and spent 6 years in a communist Vietnamese prison. He survived the ordeal and now lectures
on lessons learned from that experience.

One day when Plumb and his wife were sitting in a restaurant, a man at another table came up and said, "You're Plumb! You flew jet fighters in Vietnam from the aircraft carrier Kitty Hawk. You were shot down!" "How in the world did you know that?" asked Plumb. "I packed your parachute," the man replied. Plumb gasped in surprise and gratitude. The man pumped his hand and said, "I guess it worked!" Plumb assured him, "It sure did. If your chute hadn't worked, I wouldn't be here today."

Plumb couldn't sleep that night, thinking about that man. Plumb says, "I kept wondering what he might have looked like in a Navy uniform, a Dixie cup hat, a bib in the back, and bell bottom trousers. I wonder how many times I might have seem him and not ever said good morning, how are you or anything because, you see, I was a fighter pilot and he was just a sailor." Plumb thought of the many hours the sailor had spent on a long wooden table in the bowels of the ship, carefully
weaving the shrouds and folding silks of each chute, holding in his hands each time the fate of someone he didn't know.

Now, Plumb asks his audience, "Who's packing your parachute?" Everyone has someone who provides what they need to make it through the day. Plumb also points out that he needed many kinds of parachutes when his plane was shot down over enemy territory-he needed his physical parachute, his mental parachute, his emotional parachute, and his spiritual parachute. He called on all these supports before reaching safety. His experience reminds us all to prepare ourselves to weather whatever storms lie ahead. As you go through the New Year 2009, recognize people who pack your parachute!

In this New Year, may we all be faithful in serving one another.

## CHRISTMAS OFFERING REPORT

Thanks to your great generosity, a total of $\$ 1135.00$ was given for the support of GatewayLongview in Buffalo and the Greece Churches Habitat for Humanity. Gateway-Longview is a United Methodist-related agency that serves children and families throughout

Western New York. Plans are underway for the Greece Habitat to build its fourth house this summer.

## BUILDING SITE ASSIGNED FOR GREECE HABITAT

Greece Churches Habitat for Humanity is moving forward on its fourth project. The first home was built in the year 2000 at 44 Love Street; the second in 2003 at 27 Rauber Street; and the third in 2006 at 172 Fulton Avenue. The number of churches involved in each project has varied; but Aldersgate, Bethany Presbyterian, Greece Baptist, Greece United Methodist, and Messiah Lutheran have participated in all of them. We have considered these projects part of our commitment to our neighbors in the City of Rochester. Doug Hess continues to serve as treasurer for the group.

Fundraising to support building at the assigned site, 119 Whitney Street, has begun. Close to $\$ 29,000$ of the projected $\$ 65,000$ cost has been raised already. Watch for joint fundraisers-like the Thanksgiving pie sale-as well Aldersgate fundraisers for this purpose. Individual donations for this worthy project are always welcome, of course. Your check should be made payable to Aldersgate UMC and marked "Greece Habitat." We encourage the members of the congregation to give through our church so that we can track our second-mile giving. Also, should we set a financial goal, as we have other times, we will know how
well we are doing in reaching that goal.

Participating now in some aspect of fundraising for Habitat or later in the actual building project are both great "First Serve" opportunities. Both are good ways to discover new talents that can be used for God's work.

At the December 2008, Church Council meeting the following actions were taken:

- Regular Council meeting was preceded by our annual Charge Conference presided over this year by Rev. Ruthellen Hoyle, Wesley UM Church Pastor.
o Approved Pastors' salaries, increased by $3 \%$.
o Approved Staff salary increases of $2 \%$.
o Approved the church 2009 operating budget of $\$ 361,429$.
o Joyce Farrokh was recertified as a Lay Speaker
- Dick Caupp, Benevolence Secretary, reported that through November, we have given over $\$ 59,700.00$ in benevolence giving. Our monthly conference apportionments are $\$ 2,904$ and we are up-to-date.
- Improvements to the Sanctuary sound system are coming as per the Trustees.
- Jan Winter, Financial Secretary, reported the yearly offering received to date: $\$ 273,849$ toward our 2008 budget of $\$ 349,157$. Good news! Our income has covered our expenses over the same period.
- Approved a 2008 Christmas Postcard mailing to the community.
- Council members signed their MEMBERSHIP COVENANT statement. The Covenant was ap-
proved at the November Council meeting. All members will eventually be given the opportunity to sign their own Membership Covenants.
- 25 community families were served by White Gifts, per Jan Winter.
