From Your Pastor

We've just begun the season of Lent which will carry us through March 30. In response to God's generosity, we are looking at stepping up our commitment to Christ in several Spiritual disciplines—prayer, Bible study, worship, witness, financial giving, and service. As we grow in these areas we will grow closer to Jesus Christ and to others. Each of us is at a different place in our journey so the steps we take will be different. The important thing is that each of us is making progress in our journey to become more like Christ. I pray you are coming to worship each Sunday and that you are finding the daily devotional helpful. It's not too late to pick one up at church and get started using it. Small group lessons reinforce and enhance what we are doing in worship each week and our daily devotionals. You are welcome to join one of the three doing the study: Mondays at 7PM, Tuesdays at 1 PM or Tuesdays at 7 PM.

Before we know it will be Holy Week. Palm/Passion Sunday is March 24. That week there will be a traditional Holy Thursday service with communion at 7 PM on March 27 and a Good Friday service at 7 PM the next day. On Good Friday, the Aldersgate Actor's Guild will be presenting a drama entitled, Stages on the Way. Child care will be

available during both of these services.


The observance of Lent and Holy Week are important because they help us get in touch with the amazing love and generosity of God in Christ. That God would freely choose to become one of us and suffer and die on a cross for us is overwhelming. As we experience anew Jesus' sacrificial death on a cross, we are prepared to more deeply experience that joy of the resurrection on Easter Sunday, March 31.

This is the Good News. "God demonstrates his own love for us in this; While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8). The Great News is that this was not the end, because on the third day God raised him from the dead conquering sin and death once and for all. Because Christ is alive, we can have new abundant life now and life with him through eternity. Rejoice! Celebrate! Proclaim! Christ is risen!

HISTORY OF BEREA COLLEGE FEATURED AT MORNING CIRCLE IN MARCH

Berea College in Southeastern Kentucky, not far from Red Bird Mission, was a ministry founded before the Civil War to educate local young people isolated by geography and limited by poverty. It was unique in that it educated black and white young people together in an era when that was often illegal. Still a small school, its focus continues to be on educating the young people in its geographic area; but it has a significant international outreach. The video "Being and Becoming" relates the struggle of the college to remain true to its motto: "God has made of one blood all peoples of the earth." One of

KEEP UMCOR WORKING THRU "ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING"

Sunday, March 18, has been designated as the date for **One Great Hour of Sharing**, the special offering that supports the overhead costs of running the United Methodist Committee on Relief.

This offering is important because UMCOR receives no funds from apportionments. Because operating costs are covered by this offering, your gift later in the year to specific Advance Specials or Disaster Relief efforts go entirely to that cause.

HOUSE TO BE DEDICATED

Thanks to all of you who have participated in construction, the fifth Greece Churches Habitat for Humanity house will be dedicated on March 2. Representatives of all the participating churches and the new homeowners will be present at the service. Praise report: This time we have no remaining debt on the house for which to raise money.

COIN BOXES SUPPORT SHED BUILDING

Members of Aldersgate Youth and a number of adults have agreed to participate this summer in a project to build sheds for houses constructed by Habitat for Humanity in Rochester. House plans do not include a garage; consequently, the homeowners do not have outbuildings in which to safely store equipment like lawnmowers. Most of our youth are too young to work legally on the actual house construction. This project will be a way to involve our youth in our on-going commitment to providing housing to improve the quality of lives for those who could not otherwise afford it.


Flower City Habitat will deliver a shed kit to the Aldersgate parking lot in July. When it is complete, they will pick it up and deliver it to the designated location. Each kit will cost between \$525 & \$600. (The price will depend on the number of other youth groups participating.) The Missions Committee agreed to use the money from the Habitat Coin Boxes, distributed during Lent, to pay for the project. Any funds raised beyond the needs of this project will be used toward the next house.

If you did not get a **coin box** when it was distributed on February 17, pick up one from the missions counter, **fill it up** with your spare change or regular donation, and **return it on April 7**, the Sunday after Easter. Your generosity continues to keep moving these efforts forward to address the important concern of poverty in our area.

YOUR SPECIAL GIFT AT EASTER SUPPORTS MISSIONARY MERI WHITAKER

Thanks to churches like Aldersgate that have supported the ministry of Meri Whitaker, the Cookson Hills Center was able this year to take a major step forward by purchasing a large building next to the mission to replace deteriorating original agency buildings. Cookson Hills Center is a United Methodist ministry to the people in one of the poorest counties in the country. It provides a food shelf, clothing closet, health services, day-care, youth activities, a senior center, and a multitude of other efforts to reach out to people in the area. most of whom are Cherokee Indians. Meri works to develop local businesses like printing and embroidering clothing, selling Indian crafts, and making rubber mats from discarded tires to help people to support themselves; and she pastors a Twelve-Step Church. You can learn much more about her work by reading My Sister the Father, a delightful collection of stories about her experiences, available in our church library.

Would Like to Plan Ahead

Dear Plan Ahead,

Oh, I agree with you. I like to know what's happening, especially if it involves money!

There will be a fourth capital campaign. The big change from previous campaigns is that we will not be hiring (and paying) an outside consultant, saving a significant amount of money. Now, let me point out that the main reason churches are encouraged to hire consultants--besides providing employment for consultants--is that churches using a consultant generally raise more money than those who don't. There's no reason this has to be true for us if we all get on board and work as hard as we have in the

past. Let's make this work for us!

The Stewardship Development Team, headed up by Susan Accapezzato, has been developing a time line and reaching out to the congregation to find those willing to serve as leaders of the committees needed. (You may remember that Sue chaired the last campaign and is co-chair of the SDT.) Most of the meetings and contacts will take place in April and May with our making our pledge commitments on Sunday, May 19--Pentecost Sunday.

We're excited. Our theme is "Give to Live--Count Me In." Since we realize that we now have many new members who don't remember the "old days" of putting on our winter coats in a crowded hallway, sitting in folding chairs at the back of the sanctuary for extra seating, refreshments after services you couldn't get to because it was crowded in the parlor, almost no handicap access, small offices, and all the other limitations of our old facilities. Some of us who are thinking how cozy it was then have probably forgotten how awkward it was. We're going to spend some time talking about the opportunities for ministry we have available now that we did not have then. There will be a chance to see our original campaign video. (Some of us want to do that just to see how people have changed!)

This will be fun! (Attitude is everything.) And this is very important. Plan ahead. Get on board now; don't wait to be asked. Let Sue know that you are interested in helping. Start praying now about what the Lord would have you do financially to help Aldersgate move forward in this new century.
