# From the Pastor of Visitation and Membership Care

Dear Aldersgate Family:

Since Easter is early this year, by the time you receive your *Hinge*, we'll be facing the Post-Easter season — the time when we should consider how we can best share the Good News of the Risen Christ!

Paul Welter has some suggestions as excerpted in the <u>Joyful Noiseletter</u> (used by permission). I hope you enjoy it:

#### NURSE ROUSED DEPRESSED BOY WITH HUMOR

(Paul Welter, a counsellor in Kearney, NE, founded 333 questions that Jesus asked in the four Gospels, and wrote a fascinating new book titled What Would Jesus Ask? The following is an excerpt from the book.)

When my friend Kelly Shad was a pediatric nurse, she was able to work successfully with children who presented the hospital with giant-sized challenges.

A boy came to the pediatric unit sullen and defiant because he was the victim of a terrible farm accident that mangled one leg, broke numerous bones, and shattered dreams.

The hospital needed blood for testing, but he refused to give it. He also refused to eat. Kelly got the assignment.

When a co-worker said, "Why don't you make him eat?" Kelly responded with a Jesus method question, "Would you like to bring your lunch in and sit by his leg?"

Kelly tried a comic approach. She found a black cape and hood, and put two pieces of white chalk under her upper lips and over her lower lips.

While the boy was drowsing uneasily in bed, she climbed up behind the drapes over the air conditioner. Then she came flying out to the side of his bed yelling "All I vant iss your blood!"

He was shocked, captivated, and delighted by this playful vampire. They became good friends, and he allowed her to draw the needed blood and to bring him food to eat.

The only side-effect of this caper is that when Kelly the vampire came flying down from the air conditioner, she landed on the toes of a doctor's foot.

"When are we going to get rid of this social director and get a real charge nurse in here?" the doctor said. But when he left, Kelly noticed the doctor had a big smile on his face.

Perhaps we all need some humor and ingenuity in our lives! We all need to pray:

"O God, for this new day now dawning, make me an optimist. Although there are signs of hope surrounding me, sometimes I see only the negative, the imperfections, the decay. Teach me to refocus on the marvelous possibilities, the great potentialities, the vibrant new life which fills my world each new day. 
