We've finally had a few warm days and my daffodils are blooming — spring has arrived. Most are ready to get outside — perhaps to play a sport, take a walk, or work in the yard or garden. May is a busy month at Aldersgate, so I hope you'll find time to participate in some of the opportunities that are offered in addition to our weekly worship services. Live to Give Campaign Begins!

As you have probably noticed, the **Live to Give** campaign for debt reduction of the Building Fund has begun. On Sunday, May 19 we will ask every family to make a three-year financial commitment that will essentially be used to pay the monthly mortgage. Some financial facts to keep in mind as you consider your commitment to this fund:

- Our monthly mortgage is \$17,492.
- We currently owe \$1,268,750 on the total loan with about 11 remaining years to pay.
- This campaign is running on a shoe-string budget we have not hired anyone to help us this time.
- We are only asking for exactly what we NEED and no more.
- We are about half way through this obligation every campaign gets us closer to the end!

This is a separate commitment from the Annual Budget campaign. The Annual Budget focuses on the church's obligations for:

- Salaries and other basic operations (70%).
- Apportionments (shared ministries with other NY Methodist churches) and Benevolence (30%).

As you can see, we are a generous church already – and through God's help we have been able to make our payments since the beginning. Imagine how much more we will be able to do with mission and benevolence once the building fund is fully paid! We are praying that each of you will say, "Count Me In!"

Rummage Sale Collection Begins Monday, May 27

The Annual Rummage Sale is set for **Thursday, Friday,** and **Saturday, June 6, 7, & 8**. For the first two days of the sale, items are sold individually, but Saturday is a bag sale day. We also sell baked goods on Thursday and Friday. Many people look forward each year to being able to buy from our fine Aldersgate bakers.

The Rummage Sale is a major fundraiser for the UMW, but it is also a whole church function. Half the money raised is used toward our UMW Pledge to Mission and other mission projects, and half is used to meet a need in our own church. Again this year that second half will go to our **Building Fund**.

Please bring clean clothes in good condition for men, women, and children in all sizes. It is especially helpful if the clothes are labeled for size. We sort by small, medium, large, and extra-large for men's, women's, boys' and girls' clothes. Other items that sell well include toys, games, puzzles, books, dishes, glassware, pots and pans, knickknacks, pictures, lamps, seasonal decorations, jewelry, clothing accessories, tools, sports equipment (no bowling balls!), household furnishings, and small appliances. Bring only items that are reasonably clean and appliances that are in working order.

Drop-off donations beginning on Memorial Day, May 27. We will try to arrange help for you to get furniture or other large items to the church if help is needed. As useful as they are, we have found that hide-a-beds and sofa beds are usually heavier than we can manage. We must have all items no later than Wednesday morning, June 5. Dear Sally,

I was more than a little surprised to read recently that we have a mortgage payment of \$17,492 each month. Wow! How did that happen? What are we doing about it?

Surprised & Concerned

Dear Surprised,

You may be relatively new to the church and may not realize that more than two-thirds of our current facilities were built recently: the Sanctuary, Ide Center, Gathering Space, and Offices. We broke ground on our church's 50th anniversary and dedicated the new 17,000 sq. ft. section in November 2006. Our first Capital Campaign, begun in 2004, raised the first million dollars to start construction. We borrowed \$2.1 million to complete the financing, plus around \$150,000 in closing costs and fees.

Even though a number of banks expressed an interest in loaning the money to us, they refused the opportunity when they learned the amount needed. We turned to Trust Management, a company that specializes in arranging bond sales for churches. Bonds were sold first to members and friends of Aldersgate, who bought a large majority of them. The term of the loan was for 20 years with some bonds becoming due every six months. As bonds are paid off, the principal owed is reduced. Currently we owe \$1,268,750 plus interest to be paid off December 10, 2025. The bonds are callable if we were to receive a large enough gift to pay the mortgage off early.

We have been approached about the possibility of refinancing – even by Trust Management – and do review the matter regularly. If we were to find someone seriously willing to lend us that amount of money at a seriously lower rate of interest, we still have to consider the costs of refinancing (estimated to be around \$60,000) and whether or not we want to extend the payment period in order to get a lower monthly payment. (Right now we don't.) We would also have to bring the offer to the congregation for a vote, many of whom are current bondholders who are also strongly supporting repayment.

We have been making the monthly payments on time. It is not always easy. We have had to borrow from time to time from other church accounts. However, each time we do so, we have received a significant gift – often a bequest – that allows us to pay back the money we've borrowed from ourselves and to continue making regular payments. We are also still paying on loans we took out from the Conference to cover the cost of hiring consultants for our capital campaigns. (That's why we decided not to hire one this time. Show us with your commitments that we didn't need one!) The Lord has provided enough each month – not a surplus – just enough! That's why we keep reminding ourselves of His faithfulness!

So – what are we doing about it? We are making the payment each month, and we are praying that you will feel called to say along with the rest of us, "Count Me In," and make a pledge on May 19 to the current Building Fund Campaign to help us continue the good work of the Lord here at Aldersgate.
