

From the Pastor

For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, than serve; if it is teaching then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully. Romans 12:4-8

Together we are the body of Christ. God has brought each of us to Aldersgate for a purpose — to grow in relationship with God who is continually transforming our lives so that we might become more and more like Christ, and that we might live out God’s plan in our lives to serve Christ with joy. If one is hurting, the whole body hurts, just like when you stub your toe, your stomach often hurts. If one is absent or not doing his/her part, the whole body is less than it can be, just as when you break an ankle, you end up stumbling along. God has uniquely gifted each one of us for ministry in Christ’s name both in the church and in the community.

Think about your ministry. If you are serving as God calls you to serve, thanks be to God. If you aren’t serving much, is God calling you to work in a certain ministry? Check the bulletin for opportunities. Look at the “Ministry Map” in the Gathering Place. It shows many ways people are serving in our community and beyond. It might give you an idea of how Christ wants you to serve. If you think that God is calling you to some new or existing ministry in the church or in the community, let me know. I’ll do what I can to help you get started or get connected with people who can help you, so that you will more fully know the joy of serving Christ and bring greater joy to the body of Christ.

The following is a prayer, the Heidelberg Catechism: “Our only God and Father; I’m tempted to make the church a consumer thing, to think of it as a vendor of spiritual goods and religious services that keeps me happy and satisfied. Remind me that I share in Jesus through this body, the church, a covenant community where I have obligations to others. Make me ready to serve others for the joy of Jesus. Amen.”

Prayer Chains



Parish Visitations

Call the church office when someone enters the hospital or is discharged or if you, or someone of whom you are aware, desire a pastoral call. This will help provide better pastoral care and avoid unnecessary trips. Arrangements for the Sacrament of Holy Communion are encouraged. Both pastors and the lay visitation ministers visit regularly and would be happy to include others in the visitation schedule.

Needlework Project Days


When a family has lost everything due to a tornado, hurricane, earthquake, or flood, they may not even have soap or a towel to clean themselves up. Mothers give birth somewhere in the world each day without even a receiving blanket to wrap around their newborns. Families here in Rochester have to find shelter when they lose their homes or seek protection from abuse. The United Methodist Committee on Relief distributes health kits as part of immediate disaster relief and we can get pretty, warm afghans to help meet the needs of some of those families through Church Women United.

Ladies, we have work to do! Our Project Day in January ("It's all about H.I.M. — Hands in Mission") was well received; so the UMW Executive Committee decided to schedule such days more often, preferably in months when we don't a lot of other projects. It's a chance to be part of a project that you know will help others and perhaps a chance to learn new skills. Tasks that we may find somewhat tedious when we are doing them by ourselves (stitching together afghan patches into strips) are fun when we do them together.

On Saturdays, **July 13 and August 17**, we will gather to work from **9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** in the Ide Center. Anyone interested is welcome to join us for whatever time

she has available. This is a good mother-daughter activity. We'll have the cutting boards and sewing machines set up for making school bags, baby gowns, and receiving blankets. There will be children's quilts to tie and afghan patches to sew together for Warm-Up Rochester Afghans. (We donated three afghans last year. Can we do more this year?) If you already crochet or knit, you may want to work on baby sweaters or making more afghan patches. If you are interested in a Prayer Shawl Ministry, we'd like to talk about that.

At noon we will stop to enjoy a **light lunch**. We will be joined by the youth who will be at church that day to assemble the shed for Habitat for Humanity that will go to the house recently completed by the Greece Churches Coalition. If you wish, you may make a donation of \$5.00 toward the cost of lunch and toward the supplies we use in these projects. Please sign up on the Opportunities Board if you plan to be there for lunch just so we have a clue to how many places to set at the table.



Start Collecting for UMCOR Kits

Ads for sales of school supplies will pop up soon. They traditionally start shortly after July 4. At the UMW meeting in September, we will once again be putting together **School, Health, and Layette Kits** for the **United Methodist Committee on Relief**. We start the collection early in order to get the best prices and to reach our goals for each kind of kit.



As we have in past summers, plastic totes for each type of kit will be placed under the coat racks in the entry for you to deposit your contributions. UMW members will be counting and storing the items on a regular basis as the totes become full. All items must be new.

Each **School Kit** includes the following: **1 pair blunt scissors (rounded tip), 3 spiral-bound pads (or 150 sheets of loose leaf) of 8½" x 11" ruled paper, 1 30-centimeter ruler, 1 hand-held pencil sharpener, 6 new pencils with erasers, 1 eraser (2½"), and 1 box of 24 crayons.**

For **Health Kits** we need these items: **hand towels (15" x 25" to 17" x 27"); washcloths; large, sturdy combs at least 8" long (rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable); nail files or fingernail clippers; bath-sized (3 oz. or more) bars of soap; adult-sized toothbrushes in original wrappers; and adhesive plastic strip sterile bandages.**



Layette Kits include **cloth diapers pre-folded or plain, shirts or onesies, baby washcloths, baby gowns or sleepers, diaper pins, sweaters or hooded sweatshirts open in the front, and receiving blankets 30"x 30" or 30" x 32".**

Last year we delivered 110 School Kits, 209 Health Kits, and 35 Layette Kits to the Mission Central Hub at Cortland UMC. Through these kits we touch lives around the world by providing supplies for disaster relief and education programs.

“Mission Possible” Initiative’s First Community Dinner

Mark **July 27** on your calendar to help with our first Community Outreach Dinner. This effort is a product of the “Mission Possible” planning done on January 19 as follow-up to the 360 Missional Church development program in which we have been engaged for several years.

The first dinner will be held in the **Ide Center** from **3:00-5:00 p.m.** with a relatively simple, familiar menu: spaghetti and meatballs, salad, rolls, dessert, and beverages. **Mary Sims** is heading the committee organizing this **free meal**, which will be prepared by those who volunteered to take the Health Department training to qualify to provide meals to the public.

Help will be needed with setup, service, clean up, and security. Donations will also be needed for desserts, which must be purchased from a store or bakery according to Health Department guidelines. There will be sign-

up sheets on the Opportunities Board for you to indicate where you would like to help.

The meal will be free and open to everyone. Posters advertising the event have been placed at the Greece Food Shelf with flyers for the drivers to take out, at the Clothing Closet, and at Mission Share. Signs will also be put up on our doors at church.

When Mary presented this project to the Dewey Corridor Neighbors, a member approached her who offered to help reach out for a funding grant from an organization in the area. In addition, she has contacted area stores for donations of food and other needed supplies. The plan is to start small with the hope of being able to offer this community dinner each month with expanded services.

Let’s get behind this effort and show that we are indeed in the business of “Transforming Lives and Serving Christ with Joy.”

School Supplies also Needed Locally

In addition to the supplies collected for UMCOR, we try to collect as many items as we can for backpacks distributed by Mission Share Outreach Center and Emmanuel United Methodist Church. Both need these supplies by mid-August. When we get the list of requested supplies, we will put the information in the bulletin and post the list by totes designated for Mission Share and Emmanuel. Your generosity will help support students both here in Greece and in the City of Rochester.

Sticky Lips BBQ for Greece Coalition

Thanks to all who supported the Sticky Lips BBQ fundraiser for the Greece Churches Habitat for Humanity Coalition. With an inclusion of a \$370 matching grant from Thrivent, a Lutheran men's organization, \$2,344.50 was added to the treasury toward building the next house. If all goes according to plan (our plan — remember God sometimes intervenes), we will spend a year raising money and start the sixth house in 2015.

Food for Friends

Our collection of food and other basic products for the Greece Food Shelf on June 16 brought in **184 pounds** of food. Every pound of food helps one of our neighbors!



The Missions Committee is scheduling one Sunday each quarter to call attention to the need. Our **next "Food for Friends" Sunday will be August 18**. Remember that you do not have to wait until then to help out. The products placed in the Blue Box marked for the Greece Food Shelf every week are taken there promptly on Monday mornings by Marilyn Sobus, our Food Shelf Liaison.

We're going to be gone for several weeks this summer and I'm trying to figure out how to handle all our bills while we are gone. Does it really matter whether we pay our weekly pledge ahead before we leave, or can it wait until we get back?

A Little Fussed

Dear Fussed,

Thanks for asking. But, seriously, do you expect me to say, "Never mind; the church has plenty of money. Others will be paying their pledges."???

To say that would not only be foolish, but untrue. It will help both the church and you if you are able to pay your pledge in advance. The church's expenses are fairly similar year round whether we as individuals are present or not. And catching up after a trip — especially an expensive one — is often harder than we anticipate. It's nice to have "catching up" out of the way. Besides, you are probably not the only one going on vacation and looking at this decision.

Strictly speaking, your pledge is not a bill; but it is a commitment. We won't chase you down for the money. If you are behind, we'll just remind you through your quarterly giving report. Follow the Apostle Paul's advice in I Corinthians 16: 1-2 and II Corinthians 9:1-5 to plan ahead. The situation is different, but the concept is similar.




