It's the middle of January as I write this. I'm always amazed at how quickly the time goes. It seems like just a few days ago we started the "All IN" focus. For the past four months, the Sunday morning prayer group has continued to INtercede for (pray for) the people you wrote down. I trust you are continuing to pray daily for those you named on your index card who need to know how much God loves them and become a part of a community of faith. I pray you are investing in their lives and that God will give you opportunities to share your faith and invite them to something at church. If you weren't here last September, you can get involved by writing the names of some people you know who don't know Christ's love and/or are not part of a church family on two cards or even scraps of paper. Keep one for yourself and pray for those people every day. Give one to me and I will add your names to the list we are already praying for. (First names are good enough.) Those who already gave me their card can always add another name and give me another card if there are others you feel called to pray for. Then take time to invest yourself in their lives. Watch and see what God will do. Remember, this is not something we do for a couple months but a way of living out our faith in Christ every day.

In February our thoughts turn to love (probably thanks to Hallmark, candy companies, and jewelers). The greatest love, of course, is the love God has for us in Christ Jesus our Lord. "Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God, but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us." (1 John 4:11-12) In the Gospel according to John, Jesus commands, "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." (John 13:34)

As Christians we are called to love which includes radical hospitality—welcoming the strangers that God sends our way and INvesting in them as we do our own family and friends. This is not always easy because our natural tendency is to stick with the familiar. On Sundays before and after worship be vigilant in keeping your eyes open for those who are standing alone, whether they are new to the church or have been here for a while. Go talk with them, even if you have to catch up with your friends later. Introduce them to others. Actively listen to them. Also, pay attention to those who usually sit around you and if they aren't there, give them a call during the week. Come to the community dinner, introduce yourself to someone you don't know yet, and join them for a meal. Yet, radical hospitality is not limited to the church building. Practice hospitality wherever you are letting Christ's love shine through you. I'm sure you can think of many ways to extend hospitality and Christ's love to others. The important thing is to be aware of those around us as beloved Children of God and treat them accordingly.

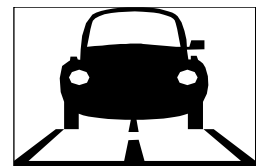

From the Pastor of Visitation and Membership Care

Dear Aldersgate Family:

As we face the cold winter days of the year 2014, what advice would be most helpful? As I pondered this question, I read some excerpts from Phil Calloway's book *When You Need a Good Laugh* quoted in *The Joyful Noiseletter* (used by permission) these words are truly:

The Right Perspective for 2014

Once asked the famous author and radio preacher Chuck Swindoll what he takes the most flack for, "Humor," he said. Though many tell him that his laugh is the only one they hear in their homes, others want him to stop.

"How do you deal with their jabs?" I asked. "Some people want you to be as miserable as they are," he responded, "and I'm not getting on that bus." Amen! The trip seems never-ending when we travel with the self-appointed guardians of misery.

Have you met sour people whose faces are cemented in a downward scowl? Genetics didn't help them, but changes are they've been sampling at least one of the following forbidden prunes.

Each time worry arrives, show it through the door of prayer. The more we pray, the less we panic.

Feed your mind on things that are honorable, pure, lovely, and of good report. They're seldom in the newspaper or on TV. They are waiting to be discovered in the pages of good books and the words of good friends.

A Habit of Rejoicing

Default to rejoicing at every opportunity, and your life will be transformed. No lie. You'll find that the God who has shown up for saints throughout history is not about to abandon you.

So rejoice, relax, and reflect on God's goodness. Hang out with positive people. Read that book of cartoons. Loosen your tie. Hug a friend's Chihuahua. Share a joke with a friend. Lighten up and laugh.

Remember God is with us whatever we face in the year before us!

Mission Share Thank You

A thank you letter from Tom Hakes, the Director of Mission Share shows the monetary contributions Aldersgate made in 2013: \$1,200 in general support, \$157 from the Souper Bowl of Caring (the youth fundraiser) and \$150 for backpacks for the start of school.

Because this letter was the statement sent for tax records to all Mission Share supporters, it did not include the donations of school supplies prior to the start of school or the regular monthly collections of toilet tissue, feminine supplies, and other personal hygiene items that have also been essential in serving their clients and probably represent a value of two or three thousand dollars. (None of us want to take the time to keep track.)

The commitment of Aldersgate to the needy in the Greece community is notable and truly appreciated. All of us who have had the pleasure of delivering supplies have had the experience of having clients and workers there greet us with smiles and exclamations of great joy. It's hard to realize the importance of such mundane items unless you have had to decide between buying those or paying an electric bill. Please continue your gen-

erous support and keep Mission Share in your prayers that this organization is able to continue to serve our neighbors in a thoughtful, Christ-like way.

Other Thank Yous

The Christmas Offering this year was designated for Gateway-Longview Family Services in Buffalo and for Cookson Hills Center in Oklahoma, both United Methodist outreach centers. Remembering that Christmas is about God's Great Gift to us led you to give \$1,037 to this special offering, of which \$519 was sent to Cookson Hills and \$518 to Gateway-Longview, as of December 31. Your generosity will help God's work in those two locations to continue.

In addition to the \$550 for the shed put together by our volunteers (picked up and delivered to a Habitat house), our Benevolence Treasurer, Dick Caupp, was able to send \$,to the Greece Churches Habitat for Humanity toward funding our sixth house. That figure is on top of sales of BBQ tickets (\$338) and pies (\$557), a portion of which is also retained by the coalition. Expect to hear some news about plans for the next house in the months ahead.
