Dear Aldersgate Family and Friends:

As I pen this note for the <u>Hinge</u> we are getting ready to start our trip back to Rochester. While attending the Ash Wednesday service at St. Luke's UMC, we realized that we are beginning the season of reflection on the death and resurrection of our Lord. We are anxious to get back to Aldersgate and share this Holy Season with you.

We have enjoyed the pansies, petunias and many other flowers during our Florida stay. However, most years we especially enjoy the fresh foliage and many flowering trees as we drive north. (We wonder if they will be blossoming this year.) This reminded me of an item that appeared in the <u>Joyful Noiseletter</u> (used by permission) entitled:



DOGWOOD BLOSSOMS IN THE OZARKS

"Today creamy blossoms are unfolding on the dogwood trees, so we know spring is here to stay. Legend says at the time of Jesus' crucifixion the dogwood was the size of an oak tree, and its wood so firm it was chosen for the cross upon which Jesus was nailed.

"Jesus said never again would the dogwood grow large enough to be used for such a cruel purpose. Today the tree's branches are bent and twisted in efforts to find the sun. Petals of the showy blossoms form a cross, and are not flowers, but bracts.

"The true flowers, clustered at the center of the bracts, form the 'crown of thorns.' The outer edges of each petal are nail prints, brown with rust and stained with red. Dogwood trees are all grace and innocence and when you see them in full flower, you will hear spring singing."

So when the Dogwood trees begin to blossom (and they will eventually) be reminded of the cost of our redemption and Christ's victory over sin and death! Then, we can really celebrate Easter!

Free Monthly Community Dinner Grows in Attendance & Support

Thanks to the vision of those who began to develop the idea as part of our Mission 360 gathering a year ago January 19, and to those who have worked to make that vision a reality, we have a regular monthly Free Community Dinner that is becoming well-established. Intended to provide a nourishing meal to people who need to stretch their food dollars at the end of the month, singles and seniors who find cooking a full meal for one or two a chore, or people looking for a safe place to socialize, this gathering on the last Saturday of the month is meeting that goal.

It is also important for Aldersgate members to attend, as well as to work at, the dinner in order to welcome our guests and become better acquainted with the people in our community. Our guests are also coming to check us out as a church and some have been returning on Sunday morning or afternoon for worship services. Two have become members and others have indicated an interest in doing so.

This program is receiving wide attention and support from the business community. Chatfield Engineers donated \$500 from their holiday fund. We have received monetary donations from BJ's, Sam's, Walmart, and Tops, and have been told that a check is coming from Wegman's. In addition Special T Cakes & Desserts donated desserts for several months.

Your Easter Offering Goes to Support Meri Whitaker

Meri Whitaker is a United Methodist Church and Community Worker for whom we have had a covenant relationship for many years, committing to pray and to providing a portion of her salary support. She is the director of the Cookson Hills Center, a United Methodist ministry in Eastern Oklahoma. The majority of the people living there are Cherokee.

The Center provides a food shelf, clothing closet, health services, day care, youth activities, a senior center, and a multitude of other efforts to reach out to people in the area, which is one of the poorest in the country. Meri works to develop local businesses like printing and embroidering clothing, selling Indian crafts, and making rubber mats from discarded tires to help people to support themselves; and she pastors a Twelve-Step Church. You can learn much more about her work by reading <u>My Sister the Father</u>, a delightful collection of stories about her experiences, available in our church library.

Gearing Up for Crop Walk

Plans are under way to host this year's Greece Crop Walk. In the 35 years that Greece churches have participated, over \$250,000 has been raised locally. Crop Walks have been held annually throughout the United States for more than 75 years, and we are part of this great tradition of helping combat hunger that started after World War II. Reports state that globally an average of 30,000 people die of starvation every day and that many people need to walk 5-6 miles just to get water suitable to drink. Crop Walk is organized through Church World Service, a relief organization based in Elkhart, Indiana and we work with representative from their Syracuse office.

This year's local walk is **Sunday, May 4th**, beginning with registration at Aldersgate at 1:30 and **starting at 2:00** with a choice of the 5-6 mile route going south on Dewey, west on Maiden Lane, north on Mt. Read, east on Latta, and south back to Aldersgate. We also have a Gold-

en Mile route from Aldersgate to English Road and back, and a minimile in our Ide Family Center.

Bethany Presbyterian and Messiah Lutheran will serve as rest stops along the route. We are being helped in the organizational process by Fred Fant from Trinity Episcopal. Larry Dennis from Messiah Lutheran is treasurer for the walk. He has also been able to secure



some matching funds from Thrivent. Wegman's has graciously donated \$100 to purchase water and snacks for our walkers.

We already have at least 8 churches participating and welcome other organizations as well. Sponsor envelopes are available from Aldersgate's office, and questions about the walk can be sent to Joyce Farrokh at her e-mail address: efarrokh@rochester.rr.com or by leaving a message at the church office at 663-3665. A Sign-Up sheet is posted on the opportunities board.

We look forward to a great walk! Come join us!

Volunteers Needed to Help Complete Building Upkeep Tasks at Aldersgate

The Trustees have identified the following list of tasks around the church as needing to be done, both short-term and long-term. Volunteer help is very welcome and necessary! If you are willing and able to work on any of these projects, please contact the Trustees so that the work can be coordinated and duplicate efforts can be avoided. Contact:

To Do: [short-term and long-term planning]

- 1. Caulk Education Wing windows; outside with Silicone Caulk.
- 2. Trim the Maple trees next to the Education Wing.
- 3. Trim the Silver Maple Tree on the west side of the parking lot back to the fence line.
- 4. Straighten out items in the storage area under the Chapel.
- 5. Replace burnt out lamps on the outside of the building. [Na: Front of Sanctuary, Multiple on west side of Education Wing, Hg by NE corner of Sanctuary/Driveway].
- 6. Paint the exposed roof trusses at the back (west) end of the chapel. (This can easily be done while standing on the flat roof section over the original kitchen.) The front (east) side should be checked.
- 7. The silver paint on the flat roof over the original kitchen (back of chapel) and education wing is thin can see black through it and we need to investigate the need to re-silver paint that roof.
- 8. Roof sealant strip between original church hall and education wing is torn loose. Needs replacement, sealant, and silver paint.
- 9. Wires to the speakers that play the chimes are not well laid out; they are lamp cord and the wire junction tape is coming loose. The wire lays in puddles. Rewire with outdoor-rated cable before it fails.
- 10. Clean, remove rust, and paint entrance area by back doors to Chapel Hall/Fellowship Hall.
- 11. Clean and paint the hallway outside of the Chapel.
- 12. 'Circuit 16' plugs in Kitchen are labeled as non-functioning.
- 13. Adjust Office lights motion detector sensors they are too sensitive now.
- 14. Curtain outside south side of Sanctuary opening to ramp area. First: exit light update.
- 15. Replace fluorescent ballasts in Education Wing; those failed and replaced all had cracked wire insulation.
- 16. Apply UV Screen sheeting on the Kitchen windows.
- 17. Source and install Sanctuary ceiling fans to help push heat downward.
- 18. Humidifiers for HVAC heating units.
- 19. Add storm windows, or replacement windows, to two outside-facing windows of the Parlor.
- 20. Look into replacement windows for Education Wing.
- 21. Vestibule to improve heat and AC control into the Gathering Space Sanctuary.
