



## New Fall Study Opportunities

A new small group is forming on Monday evenings that will meet from 7-8:15 p.m. on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Mondays of each month. If you haven't been a part of a small group or haven't been in one for a while this is a great opportunity to try it out. Our first Study together is a six-session study called "The Prodigal God" which focuses on Jesus' parable (most commonly known as the "prodigal son") found in Luke 15:11-32. Members of small groups study the Bible together, pray for and support one another, and encourage each other in their walk with Christ. ## Come One, Come All!

### Assemble UMCOR Kits on September 25

Please keep those supplies coming for the United Methodist Committee on Relief Kits. Use the updates on the items still needed in the bulletin each Sunday to guide your shopping. Thanks to your generosity so far, we have many boxes of items already stored in Room 1. School supplies for Mission: Share and our Hispanic Ministry have already been distributed.

We are again aiming for 100 School Kits, 200 Health Kits, and 50 Layette Kits. We will, however, assemble as many kits as we can with the supplies that come in. In our country alone we have experienced flooding in unexpected places. Hurricane season is just beginning. We need to fill the Mission Central warehouse shelves.

Health Kits are the most used for disaster relief. It is not unusual for Mission Central to report sending out a shipping container with 10,000 Health Kits to a single site. How do they get so many when we only put together a few hundred? It takes a few each from many, many United Methodist Churches around the country—the magic of a connectional church! School and layette supplies are more often used as part of the long-term recovery effort or in areas where those items are in chronic short supply.

Join us in the Ide Center on Thursday, **September 25, at 6:15 p.m.** for a quick meal and a great hands-on mission project. There are jobs for everyone—men, women, and youth.. Those of you who want exercise can go up and down the lines to put kits together. Those who need to work sitting can count out supplies or check kits. It takes a lot of help to get these jobs done.

The evening will begin with supper (likely pizza, salad, and dessert), although you may do some work as soon as you arrive. The cost of the **supper is just \$5.00 per person** payable at the door. Please do **sign up** on the bulletin board in advance, however, so that we know how many places to set at the table.

### Facility Project Help Appreciated!

The Trustees wish to thank everyone who helped work on the list of Aldersgate Work Tasks in the recent months. A number of tasks were completed over the summer timeframe:

1. Moving and re-setting furniture during the lamp replacements with LEDs project.
2. Repair of the door lock unit on one Gathering Space outside door.
3. Replacement of the door closer to the back entrance near the Chapel.
4. Replacement of sink with leaking faucet in Ladies' Room outside Fellowship Hall.
5. Trim the maple trees away from the building by the Education Wing.
6. Trim the silver maple tree on the west side of the parking lot back to the fence line.
7. Bag, seal, and move Gym floor remnants from Fellowship Hall storage room to storage area under Chapel.
8. Replacement of the broken dishwasher in the Rental House.
9. Re-do back door entrance to Rental House with new wood and paint.
10. Re-set and mortar loose bricks to Rental House front steps.
11. Scraping loose paint off the Rental House walls and trim.
12. Re-doing the Rental House back entrance and painting this area.

Aldersgate is still in need of people who can help with other work tasks. This is a great opportunity for fellowship and will make a positive impact on Aldersgate's facilities. ***Please look over the list on the following page and contact us if you are able to help in any way.***

## Work Tasks Needed at Aldersgate

The Trustees have identified the following list of tasks needed at Aldersgate. If you are willing and able to help with any of these, please contact the Trustees so that materials and work can be coordinated and we can avoid duplicate effort. ### In Process:

1. Curtain outside south side of Sanctuary opening to ramp area. [Color(s)?] Rod ready, need curtain.
2. Finish painting gutter area over Chapel with "Software Gray" paint. Help install new gutters once painting is completed.
3. Apply UV Screen sheeting on the outside of the Kitchen Windows.

### To Do: [short-term and long-term planning]

1. Continue caulking Education Wing windows.
2. Clean return air vent in new Kitchen for ventilation system.
3. In bathrooms near Chapel: Clean fan vent grates and lubricate fans.
4. Replace/repair non-functioning light socket in Gathering Space.
5. The exposed roof trusses at the back (west) end of the chapel have been scraped; now need sanding and painting. (This can easily be done while standing on the flat roof section over the original kitchen.) The front (east) side also needs scraping and painting.
6. Remove cinder blocks and second dish post from roof over Room #8.
7. Roof sealant strip between original church hall and education wing is torn loose. Needs replacement, sealant, and silver paint.
8. The silver paint on the flat roof over the original kitchen (back of chapel) and education wing is thin - can see black through it - and we need to re-silver paint that roof. Leaks are appearing.
9. Clean, dust inside of doors, remove rust, and paint entrance area (inside and outside) by back doors to Chapel Hall/Fellowship Hall. Stairs up from outside door are scraped and need sanding and painting with "Biscuit" color.
10. Clean and paint the hallway outside of the Chapel.
11. 'Circuit 16' plugs in new Kitchen are labeled as non-functioning. Poor location for electric plugs; remove and block with cover plate.
12. Repair buckling book shelves in Library.

### Rental Property Projects

1. Nail down loose roof flashing – near chimney and over garage.
2. Repair/replace cracked or missing windows at basement level.
3. Scraping Done: Re-paint white outside trim.
4. Scraping Done: Re-paint blue house.
5. Southeast basement window needs repair so that it closes.




## Back to Church Sunday is September 7<sup>th</sup>!

## Kidsgate Curriculum

### K-3

Our Kindergarteners through 3rd graders will continue using the *Grow, Proclaim, Serve* Program. September's lessons will come from the unit *In the Beginning* based on the Bible verse, "Lord, you have done so many things! You made them all so wisely! The earth is full of your creations!" Psalm 104:24. The children will learning through activities where they will hear, understand and experience Bible stories, be encouraged to apply the stories to their lives, and to serve other in their own church and community.

## Food for Friends Sunday

We encourage you to bring non-perishable food for the Greece Food Shelf each Sunday, but four times a year we try to highlight the need in our local community with a "Food for Friends" Sunday. The week before the ushers will distribute grocery bags to remind you of this special emphasis. Then, when you shop that week, pick up extra grocery items to help our neighbors. "Food for Friends" Sunday this quarter is **September 14**.



The need continues to grow here in the suburbs. When social security checks or food stamps don't last until the end of the month, people need somewhere to turn to keep their families fed. An increasing number of those who need help are working full time, but just don't make enough to cover living costs. Many who have found jobs since the recession are working for less than they did before. Let's be conscious of these circumstances while we shop and be ready to share with our neighbors. Put our love into action.

## WANTED: Your Empty Pill Bottles

We will soon put another box on our Missions table to collect empty plastic prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles. Remove the labels with your personal information and rinse the bottles out before you bring them in. **Matthew 25 Ministries** in Cincinnati, OH, collects and ships the bottles to hospitals and health clinics in developing countries to improve the quality of health care. Often patients have to be sent home with their prescription pills in their hands or wrapped in a leaf because no containers are available. Like the collection of labels from Campbell's and General Mills products, this is another way we can make a difference in the lives of others at no cost and without a lot of effort on our part.

## Several Plan Mission Trip to Nicaragua — How About You?

For a number of years, Ted and Mary Anderson have led a Genesee Valley Mission Trip to Project Chacocente in Masaya, Nicaragua, during the winter school break. This February 14-21 several from Aldersgate, including Pastor Anne, plan to join them for the first time.

Project Chacocente is a ministry that has moved families who have been living in the dump in Managua to the Chacocente community where they are educated and trained for a productive life and the opportunity to live in their own homes. They prepare by completing a five-year covenant with Project Chacocente and helping to build their home. The Chacocente Christian School now has 150 students and will graduate its first seniors this year. Go to [www.outofthedump.org](http://www.outofthedump.org) for more information.

The cost is \$2,000 per person, which includes airfare, transportation, lodging, food, tips, supplies and materials, program costs, and a financial gift to Project Chacocente. Airline tickets will be purchased by December 1.

Reserve a spot in this mission with a deposit of \$1,000 or more or full payment by October 25. The second payment of \$500 is due December 1

and the remainder by January 3. If you would like to go but have serious concerns about the cost, there may be help available from other members of the church.

Remember that while you are going to share your Christian love, you will gain even more from your relationships with your new Nicaraguan friends if you are open to change and flexible enough to receive as well as give grace.

## Are You Fearless?

On September 28<sup>th</sup>, we will begin a four-week stewardship series called "Fearless Generosity."
