
Yolickity Fundraiser, August 17-23

Collection of School Supplies Starts Soon

Mid-July you will see the blue-gray totes lined up under the coat racks in the Gathering Space ready to receive supplies for **Backpacks** for our **Hispanic Ministry and Mission Share** and **School Kits for the United Methodist Committee on Relief**. This annual project is important because it provides local children with the school supplies they need and helps to stock the shelves at Mission Central in Mechanicsburg, PA with kits ready to be shipped out for disaster relief and educational projects undertaken by UMCOR in the United States and around the world.



Ads for sales of school supplies traditionally start shortly after July 4. We begin collecting early in order to get the best prices. While we don't put the UMCOR kits together until the UMW meeting on September 24, the backpacks for the Hispanic Ministry and Mission Share will be needed in August for the start of school here. UMW

members will be counting and storing the items on a regular basis as the totes become full. All items must be new. Lists of supplies needed for each ministry will be in the weekly bulletins and available on the mission table in the Gathering Space.

Collection of supplies for **UMCOR Health Kits and Layette Kits** will start **in late August**, although many of us are already purchasing needed items as we see them on sale. Some have found that collection of all the supplies at once was confusing; so we decided to try spreading out the process.

Last year we sent 100 School Kits, 200 Health Kits, and 45 Layette Kits along with boxes of additional supplies. Can we do better this year?

Your support for these projects puts your love for God and his children into action on the front lines of disaster or poverty relief locally and around the world. It's a testimony that we are truly "serving Christ with joy."

Members of Sew 'n Sew's are currently working on school bags, baby sweaters, baby gowns, and receiving blankets for UMCOR kits. They will also continue to make Warm-Up Rochester afghans and caps for preemies at local hospitals.

Church Refinancing FAQs

Why did we originally sell bonds to finance the building addition?

When we originally built the addition, we were only able to get the financing through the sale of bonds. Several local banks approached us, but none were willing to give us the \$2,100,000 that we needed. So, we raised money by selling bonds. This put us at about 8.5% interest rate – which was good at the time.

Who bought the bonds?

About half were purchased by Aldersgate families, the others were purchased by people across the country.

What do we pay now for the mortgage?

We are currently paying \$17,492 each month. This is quite a stretch!

Why refinance now?

We currently have a balance of \$1,012,000. We can get in the range of 4.6% interest if we refinance. That would put the payment in the range of approximately \$8,500 a month for a 15-year mortgage or approximately \$10,500 for a 10-year mortgage. This is a tremendous savings!





Are we asking for 10 or 15 years?

We are going to ask for a 15-year mortgage, but try to pay it off in 10 years. That way, if we have a slower income month, we can pay less one month and then pay more as often as we can.

What if I bought a bond – how does this affect me?

Once the refinancing is completed, the bonds will be liquidated and you will receive a check. All interest earned will also be received.

Do we need approval from current bond holders to liquidate their bonds?

No, we can do this without bond holder approval. However, we want to make sure that all Aldersgate people who own bonds are aware of what we hope to be doing.

Have we been approved yet?

We are currently working with Canandaigua National Bank to secure the loan. Paperwork has been submitted and the building has been toured, so we are waiting for their decision. Once approved, it will require the approval of our congregation.

What if we don't get approved?

Then we talk to another bank and try again! We have already talked to another bank and have found interest in working with us.

How do we go about getting the approval of the congregation?

A meeting for the congregation will be announced two weeks prior to the date for the vote. The exact date and time will be announced as soon as we have the bank approval.

Who can vote?


All members of Aldersgate United Methodist Church are eligible to vote.

How will this affect my current pledge to the Building Fund?

We hope everyone will continue giving at their current rate. We still will need all the money to pay the mortgage – and we want to pay it off as quickly as we can! New pledges are welcome!
