It's hard to believe summer is almost over. I pray you have had a wonderful summer. I have enjoyed having some down time and am energized for all the things starting and re-starting in September.

On September 13, we kick off the new Sunday school year. I'm excited that we are starting a new pre-school class. Look for more information in this newsletter about all the classes offered on Sundays this fall.

Also on September 13 is our 60th anniversary celebration! It's been ten years since we broke ground on the church addition. Many ministries we never imagined before are possible because of the decisions and sacrifices of countless people over the past 60 years. Elsewhere in this *Hinge* you will find more information about this celebration. I hope you'll join us, not just to look back, but to imagine the future because God is faithful!

This fall we are implementing the intentional discipleship program that we've been working on for the last year and a half. We are also hoping to hold a short-term study on Christian Parenting this fall. If you are interested, please let me know so we can determine the best time to hold it. 

Enjoy Supper & Help Assemble UMCOR Kits on September 24

Please keep those supplies coming for the United Methodist Committee on Relief Kits. Use the updates on the items still needed in the bulletin each Sunday to guide your shopping. Thanks to your generosity so far, we have many boxes of items already stored in Room 1. School supplies for Mission: Share and our Hispanic Ministry have already been distributed.

We are again aiming for 100 School Kits, 200 Health Kits, and 50 Layette Kits. We will, however, assemble as many kits as we can with the supplies that come in. Health Kits are used for basic relief in every major disaster. Shipping containers with 10,000 Health Kits often go to major sites. An article in *Response* magazine this year noted that the only reason UMCOR doesn't distribute more layette kits is that they don't have them. We need to help fill the Mission Central warehouse shelves.

Join us in the Ide Center on Thursday, **Sept. 24**, at **6:15 p.m.** for a quick meal and a great hands-on mission project. There are jobs for everyone – men, women, and youth. Those of you who want exercise can go up and down the lines to put kits together. Those who need to work sitting can count out supplies or check kits. It takes a lot of help to get these jobs done.

The evening will begin with supper (likely pizza, salad, and dessert), although you may do some work as soon as you arrive. The cost of the **supper** is **just \$5.00 per person** payable at the door. Please **sign up** on the bulletin board in advance, however, so that we know how many places to set at the table.





Dear Sally Stewardship

Dear Sally,

It was good news that we are going to be able to refinance the remainder our church mortgage at a lower rate. I understand that if we pay it off in ten years, we can do so with a payment of about \$11,029 a month compared with the current payment of \$17,492. What do we plan to do with that \$6,463 difference that's left over each month?

Let's Use Our Money Wisely

Dear Use Money Wisely,

Aha! Wouldn't that be a lovely problem to have! Unfortunately that is not the situation we find ourselves in. There is no extra \$6,000 a month. Our last capital campaign fell quite short of fully funding the monthly payments. That's why we have felt it was important each year to designate half the rummage sale and auction proceeds for the Building Fund, to ask for special gifts, and to continue even the small fundraisers like the monthly Aldersgate Dining Out events.

What has been a significant help was one of our members listing us as an annual beneficiary to the income (approximately \$10,000 a year) from a foundation gift. Most recently the \$50,000 bequest from John Haldane has provided for several months the difference between capital campaign pledge income and the amount due. That money has been used. The timing of our being able to refinance is really just another example of God's timing and God's provision of our needs rather than our wants.

But, speaking of bequests, we would have had neither had we not asked. That's why on the last Sunday of each month you see the question in the bulletin, "Have you remembered Aldersgate in your will?"

Including your church in your will is a way to continue your support of ministry here when you are no longer present to do so. It serves as a significant testimony to your loved ones and your church family of how important your fellowship with the Lord and the ministry of Aldersgate have been to you. If you would like to discuss taking such a step with someone, speak to Pastor Anne or a member of the Stewardship Committee. If that member does not feel comfortable talking with you

about the topic, s/he will be able to recommend someone knowledgeable.

Just another thought – while we are on this sensitive subject, may I suggest one more thing? Please let your family know that you would like to have the remainder of any pledges you have made completed if the money is available. This is strictly voluntary because we certainly don't ask families for the money. However, quite frankly one of the reasons we have come up short even on current expense income in recent years is that we have lost a number of older members whose regular giving we had counted on. We do have new givers. However, it often takes a while for those new givers to grow into the ability and the practice of regular, generous giving.

Now, on a more upbeat note: we actually do hope that we will have renewed enthusiasm around paying off our mortgage so that we can turn to further expansion of the Lord's ministry in our community. We can prepay as much as 25% of the remaining mortgage any year. (Should someone wish to give us a million dollars at some point, I'm sure we could come up with the pre-payment penalty as well!)

I'm sure this is more information than you had in mind, but please pray about it to see what the Lord would have you do. Our fall finance campaign scriptural theme fits: "They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasures of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life." (I Timothy 6:18-19)

60TH Anniversary Gifts to Benefit the Building Fund

We challenge you to make a special gift this month in honor of the 60th Anniversary of Aldersgate and the 10th anniversary of the groundbreaking for the now not-sonew facilities. If you are a long-time member, consider how God has provided and how our ministry here has benefited from our stepping up to the challenge in 2005. (Too often we forget how really cramped we were in the approximately 8,000 sq. ft. we used to live with.) If you have started attending more recently, and Aldersgate has always had about 25,000 sq. ft. of wonderfully arranged facilities, consider a gift in honor of those with the foresight to act on God's direction. These donations will be designated, of course, for the Building Fund to pay on the mortgage. We challenge you to consider a gift with a "60" in it – \$60, \$600, \$660, etc.

Building Fund Refinancing Approved

On Sunday, August 3, the members of Aldersgate unanimously voted to accept the offer from Canandaigua National Bank to refinance the church mortgage.

This will result is substantial savings to Aldersgate. We still need the support of everyone to continue paying the mortgage, but the lower rate—will allow us to pay off the loan more quickly with less cost.
