From the Pastor

Once again, the summer has flown by. It's been great. There has been a lot going on at church but the pace has been more relaxed. On August 14, our African community started weekly worship at 2 PM. The service is joyful, the music great, and they translated for us. I encourage you to try it one Sunday.

As much as I hate for the summer to be over, I am looking forward to the fall. Our fall kick-off weekend begins with an opportunity to attend a Rhino's soccer game on Saturday, September 10 (see p. 3). Sunday, September 11 will kick off the fall programing. You'll have the opportunity to sign up for small groups and ministries both within the church and in the community.

God is up to amazing things at and through the ministries of Christ at Aldersgate. God is doing things we could never do on our own. In addition to the African ministry, the Hispanic ministry, the Community Dinner, Grief Share, and others, we have an opportunity to increase our partnership with English Village School. I know God is calling a couple people to help them hold a few short-term, after-school clubs. If God is calling you to this ministry let me know. We also have the opportunity to partner with Lake United Methodist Church in starting Celebrate Recovery. This is a wonderful ministry to help people recover from hurts, habits, and hang-ups. Actually, we all have them so this could be of benefit to each of us. Our prayer is that this ministry will not only benefit church people, but connect people who are not now part of the church with Christ and the church. Even if you don't plan to be a part of the program, you can help through your prayers and/or service. The kick-off is at 6 PM on Thursday, September 22. Stop over at the Lake Church (4409 Lake Ave between the Parkway and Latta on the west side of the street) for hot dogs and to hear a great Christian band.

The 13-week study called Experience God will be held on Mondays at 7 PM starting September 12. The study requires about ½ hour of work each day and a weekly group meeting. It's intended to help us know and do the will of God. If you haven't let me know that you are interested in this study, please call me right away. Class books are \$16 each.

God doesn't expect us to be involved in every opportunity, but God does want each of us to be in worship, Christian fellowship, and serving according to our unique gifts and passions. It's what abundant living is all about.

Keep Those UMCOR Supplies Coming!

The United Methodist Committee on Relief relies on the kits supplied by local churches like Aldersgate for its work in disaster relief such as that going on now in Southern Louisiana as well as in their year-round educational and maternal childcare efforts around the world.

Join the fun as we assemble the supplies you have been gathering into school, health, and layette kits for delivery to the Cortland Hub of Mission Central, an UMCOR warehouse in Pennsylvania.

We are again aiming for 100 School Kits, 200 Health Kits, and 50 Layette Kits. We will, however, assemble as many kits as we can with the supplies that come in. Health Kits are used for basic relief in every major disaster. Any extra supplies are sent along with the kits to be used in kit assembly at the warehouse. It takes as many as 10,000 Health Kits, for instance, to fill a shipping container destined for a major disaster site.

Please keep those supplies coming. Use the updates on the items still needed in the bulletin each Sunday to guide your shopping. Thanks to your generosity so far and the work of Sew 'n Sew's, we have many boxes of items already stored in the UMW Room.

Join us in the Ide Center on Thursday, **September 29, at 6:15 PM** for a quick meal and a great hands-on mission project. There are jobs for everyone--men, women, and youth. Those of you who want exercise can go up and down the lines to put kits together. Those who need to work sitting can count out supplies or check kits. It takes a lot of help to get these jobs done.

The evening will begin with supper (likely pizza, salad, and dessert), although you may do some work as soon as you arrive. The cost of the **supper is just \$5.00 per person** payable at the door. Please do **sign up** on the bulletin board in advance, however, so that we know how many places to set at the table.
