From the Pastor

I recently read something written by Karoline Lewis that intrigued me. The title was, *Choose Your Lent*. She went on to suggest "Your starting point matters. You can suffer through Lent. Or, you can choose to move through Lent from a place of wonder and gratitude: wondering where God might show up, what God might reveal in this dormant time, this time set aside so as to anticipate life, a time that looks forward to glimpses of the new creation." (Internet article, Feb. 4, 2016)

Lent is the 40-day period (which excludes Sundays) of preparation for the celebration of the Lord's resurrection. It's generally a somber time of examining our lives and doing what we can to learn to live more faithfully. Many people give things up for Lent to experience in some small way solidarity with Jesus' sacrificial death. There's nothing wrong with that, but I think, as Karoline Lewis suggests, that our attitude in approaching this makes a difference. We can look at Lent as an opportunity to grow closer to God in Christ or we can see it as something to endure. I choose to see it as opportunity.

Our opportunity begins March 1, to come together for an Ash Wednesday worship service at 7 PM. Worship each Sunday will focus on one what Steve Harper identifies as *Marks of a Methodist*. These are based on a sermon John Wesley, the father of Methodism, wrote in 1742, called *The Character of a Methodist*. Each mark is a practice that when followed will help us live a righteous life filled with goodness, peace, and joy. We have an opportunity to explore loving God, rejoicing in God, giving thanks, praying constantly, and loving others.

I'm excited about a new opportunity being offered on Wednesday evenings at 7 PM starting March 8. Lisa Deutsch will lead a 6-week study on Prayer (see p. 3). Also, on March 25 we will hold our first session of Aldersgate U from 9 - 11:20 AM. During that time three Discipleship Discussions will be offered. Anyone interested in joining Aldersgate should plan to attend these sessions, but everyone is welcome. See more details on p. 7. Two more sessions of Aldersgate U covering 3 additional Discipleship Discussions each will be held April 8 and April 29. If you are interested in joining the church but unable to attend these sessions, please see me and we'll try to work something out.

Please join us for Moving Forward Saturday, March 18 from 9-11:30 AM (see p. 3). We'd like everyone to be a part of helping us discern where God is leading us as a church. What is our next ministry experiment? Our Community Dinner came out of our last meeting like this. What a blessing it has been for us and our community.

I pray you'll choose to move through Lent with a sense of wonder and gratitude and take part in the opportunities for worship and study.

Lenten Prayer Study Begins March 8

Come join us as we begin a 6-week prayer journey during Lent to discover the secrets of effective prayer. Maxie Dunham's "The Workbook of Intercessory Prayer" will serve as our guide. You will be asked to give 20 - 30 minutes each day to read about prayer (usually 1 - 2 pages) and record your thoughts. Coffee Connection Founder to Speak at General Meeting

She started Coffee Connection in 2011 to help women recovering from drug addiction, trauma, and homelessness by providing training, employment and support on their road to a lasting recovery by selling fair trade, organic coffee to retail and wholesale customers. The location of the first store is on South Avenue and another one is on East Main Street. A third location, Cannonball Café located on Lake Avenue, recently closed. Ms. Bergfalk will speak both to the need for resources like those Coffee Connection provides and to her experiences.

Lenten Offering for Greece Habitat Project

This year's special Lenten Offering is again designated for the Greece Churches Habitat for Humanity Coalition, which is now raising funds to build their seventh house. They already have 22% of the needed funds on hand. On March 5, the first Sunday in Lent, the ushers will distribute small cans in which you can place your spare change throughout Lent to help move forward the important work of building another home in the city. Each time you drop in a contribution, please take the time to pray for those working on Habitat homes and for those preparing to be the future homeowners. The filled coin cans, while not costing us much at any one time, can add up to a tidy contribution from all of us together toward the goal of raising another \$65,000 for that house. Please return the filled cans to church on Easter Sunday. Your every gift will be appreciated.

Food for Friends

The Missions Committee has chosen **Sunday**, **March 19**, for our first quarter special emphasis on bringing in nonperishable food products for the Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf. This important emergency service needs a regular supply of the following items: **cereal (both hot and cold)**; **rice (1 or 2 lb. pkgs.)**; **Ramen noodles**; **pudding**; **Jello**; **juice**; **canned pasta**; **pasta (dry)**; **spaghetti sauce**; **hash**, **chili or stew**; **pork'n beans**; **canned meat or fish**; **tuna fish**; **peanut butter**; **instant mashed potatoes**; **soups**; **jelly or jam**; **canned vegetables**; **cake mixes**; **canned fruit**; **toilet paper**; **dish detergent**; **bar soap**; **shampoo**; **toothpaste**; **deodorant**; **paper towels**; **and laundry soap**. The ushers will distribute grocery bags the Sunday before as a reminder.

Marilyn Sobus, who delivers our donations to the Food Shelf, reported to the Missions Committee that **Aldersgate donated** a total of **1,549 lbs. of food in 2016.** Let's see if we can do even better in 2017!

Community Dinner Year-End News

While Mary Sims, the coordinator of the Free Community Dinner, says that "the Community Dinner is not about numbers...but it is nice to know how many people we have reached..." In 2016 dinner was served to 2,329 people by 329 volunteers (plus others that did not sign in). The total coast was \$3,088.05, and the contributions from the dinners was \$3,380.04. Thanks to additional monthly donations of food from the Open Door Mission, they were able to feed everyone for just \$1.35 per person. The group is also grateful for the donations this year of a cooler and a warmer that help the workers keep food at appropriate temperatures for safety.

Mark the last Saturday in the month to attend this outstanding outreach effort. Don't feel uncomfortable because you don't feel you need a "free" dinner. (You can always make a donation.) We need Aldersgate people to sit with the newcomers to our church to welcome them, to get to know them, and to invite them to church. If you do want to volunteer, check the sign-up sheet each month to see where you are needed.

Mission Share Needs Your Help

Dear Sally Stewardship

Dear Sally,

You just offered a short course in personal budgeting, and I missed it. Will it be offered again? I think I am managing pretty well, but should I think about taking it?

Wondering

Dear Wondering,

We do have a small "waiting list" of interested people, and those who just completed our recent course offering of "Freed Up Financial Living" endorsed it enthusiastically. Some said they'd consider taking it again. I've viewed this course as a facilitator at least three times (this time and in its previous incarnation as "Good Sense Budgeting.") I don't necessarily learn anything new after three views, but I do pick up reminders of the importance of strategies I've forgotten. I also enjoy the humor with which they deal with the various issues.

"Freed Up Financial Living" is a course presented by Christian personal finance advisors based at Bill Hybels' Willowcreek Church. One of the first concepts they highlight is the reminder that ALL "our" resources belong to God and are given to us to manage. They urge us to practice Biblical stewardship of those resources by first returning to God ten percent of what we are given. If we haven't been doing that all along, practicing tithing (giving ten percent) can be a shock to the system. They also recognize that some of us have gotten deeply in debt, whether it is from making up for a too-slim paycheck, accumulating credit card debt, incurring heavy medical debt or student loans, etc. Ten percent may be just too much. Their point is that in good faith we need to start giving *something* off the top and to work toward ten percent as our situation improves using the other strategies they suggest.

The other early big reminder is that with the second ten percent we should be paying ourselves—start saving for emergencies, for expected replacements of vehicles and appliances, schooling, for retirement, etc. Again, that process may have to start small, but we need a commitment to do that and to grow toward the full ten percent.

Then we have ALL the remaining eighty percent to pay down debt and to cover our day-to-day expenses. Of course, some trimming may be necessary to be sure that those expenses fit into the eighty percent. That's what the rest of the course is about—addressing many of the traps and myths we find ourselves caught up in, assisting us in deciding what is important and what is not, thinking outside of the box in dealing with emergency expenditures, and so on.


