From the Pastor

Once again I'm amazed how quickly time goes. It's one of the reasons we need to live each day that God gives us to the fullest and give God thanks for each day. As I write this there are not many signs of spring, other than daffodils starting to poke through the snow, but soon there will be many. Of course, Easter is the most promising and hopeful sign of new life. Christ rose from death and because of that we know that he is with us now and will be with us through eternity. Alleluia!

Before we celebrate **Easter on April 16**, we take time to walk with Jesus through his suffering and death. On Sunday, **April 9**, we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem when people welcomed him with shouts of 'Hosanna' and waved palm branches. We also look at the week ahead and his death. On Thursday evening (**April 13**), at 7 PM, we will gather for worship, see a drama, called the trial, and celebrate communion and Jesus' last supper before his death. There will also be a service at 7 PM on Good Friday (**April 14**) for a quiet remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion. Then, of course, we have the glorious celebration of his resurrection on Easter. I hope you will be a part of all that takes place in this most important week in our Christian faith.

During April there are also several other important days in the life of our community of faith. On **April 2**, many in our African community will be joining the church. I hope many of those who attend the other services will come at 2 PM that day to welcome and support them. There are two Sessions of Aldersgate U. I hope many of you will participate in the Discipleship Discussions, especially those who are considering joining the church. The schedule is on page 3.

Another important event that I encourage everyone to attend is "Moving Forward: Step 2" from 9-11:30 AM on Saturday, April 22. On March 18, we brainstormed many ideas for mission and church programs to which God may be calling us. Step 2 is to determine if someone is called to lead an effort and to prioritize which ideas to implement. Even if you couldn't make the first step, I encourage you to be a part of the next step. One idea that we already decided to move forward on is a Community Garden. See Carol Cobia or let me know if you'd like to be a part of this great opportunity. You can pick up a copy of the entire list of ideas on the shelf behind the welcome table.

I pray you will have a wonderful April and be blessed by God through the church and the many opportunities to worship and serve the Risen Lord.





Donations to St. Pauly's Supports Greece Churches Habitat Build

Your donations to the St. Pauly Textile clothing drop-off shed at Greece United Methodist Church helped support the Greece Churches Habitat for Humanity Coalition in 2016 by raising \$1,132 for the next build. St. Pauly's estimated that approximately 23,710 garments were donated to the shed, enough to clothe an estimated 2,784 people. The clothing is distributed to one or more of 44 countries, including the United States.

Donations should include used clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, linens, pillowcases, blankets, curtains, and stuffed animals. Any furniture, electronics, household items, books, toys, garbage, pillows, rags, and fabric scraps must be discarded into the rubbish container at Greece UMC by our church representatives before the St. Pauly truck comes each week for pick up. (To personalize this, our faithful representative checking the shed is Bud Kress.)

Keep in mind that right now we ask the members of our congregation to save all good new and used clothing— and most of the items you can't drop off at the shed—for the Aldersgate Rummage Sale in June. At the end of the sale we pack up and deliver all the remaining eligible clothing, etc. to the St. Pauly shed to benefit our Greece Churches build.

Lenten Coins Help Habitat Build

Please remember on Easter Sunday to return your Lenten coin boxes—preferably filled with coins—or a check to support the efforts of the Greece Churches Habitat for Humanity Coalition to build its seventh house in the City of Rochester. If you choose to write a check, please make it payable to *Aldersgate UMC* with a designation "For Greece Habitat."

Your Easter Offering is Designated for Meri Whitaker

Meri Whitaker is a missionary assigned here in the United States to work at Cookson Hills Center in Eastern Oklahoma. She provides a living witness to the love of Christ and leads the comprehensive effort to lift the lives of people in this very poor area, most of whom are Cherokee Indians. We have been providing a portion of her salary support for more than 20 years.



The work of the Center includes a food shelf, clothing closet, health services, daycare, youth activities, a senior center, and a multitude of other efforts. Meri works to develop cottage industries like screen-printing and embroidering clothing, selling Indian crafts, and making rubber mats from discarded tires to help people to support themselves. (We've ordered our Aldersgate tee-shirts and aprons from Cookson Hills.) In addition, she pastors a Twelve-Step Church. You can learn much more about her work (and her wonderful sense of humor and compassion) by reading *My Sister the Father*, a delightful collection of stories about her experiences, available in our church library.

Mission Share Auction Set for Saturday, April 22

One of two major fundraisers to support the work of Mission Share Outreach Center will be held April 22 at the First Bible Baptist Church, 990 Manitou Road, from 2-4:30 PM. Note both the change of weekday and location from previous years. Attendance at the event is free, but you must purchase a bidder number to bid on auction items. If you pre-register, the cost is just \$5.00 per number. The day of the event, bidder registration will be \$10.00 each. (See Gretchen Hughes to pre-register.) There will be both silent and live auction items and "buy now" tables where items will sell at a fixed price. Food trucks, Dukes Donuts, and Core Life Eatery will all be on hand to feed you with a portion of their proceeds donated to the event.


