Christ is risen! Christ is risen, indeed! Alleluia! Happy Easter! Before you tell me I'm a couple weeks late and that Easter was almost two weeks ago on April 16, I want to remind you that on the Christian calendar Easter is a season that lasts fifty days. A Great Recycling Event — Our Annual Rummage Sale Coming Up!

Springtime is time for cleaning up and de-cluttering. Have you noticed the "how-to" articles in the paper complete with "tips" on simplifying your life? Are you anticipating a move in the next few years to a smaller living space? Feeling a little guilty whenever we talk in church about "living simply so that others can simply live?" Now is the time to get busy!

Your "clutter" may be just what someone else needs. What usable items do you see that you no longer need? Don't overlook the decorative items in your living spaces that you would really like to replace with something fresher. Those clothes and that "clutter" can help someone shopping at our Rummage Sale set up a new household or meet needs for clothing for the coming year — not to mention raising money for our church and UMW mission projects.

The Annual Rummage Sale is set for **Thursday**, Friday, and Saturday, June 8, 9 & 10. For the first two days of the sale, items are sold individually, but Saturday is a bag sale day and we are open to negotiation on larger items. We also sell **baked** goods on Thursday and Friday. Many people look forward each year to being able to buy from our fine Aldersgate bakers.

Donation drop-offs begin on Memorial Day, May 29. We will try to arrange help for you to get furniture or other

large items to the church if help is needed. As useful as they are, we have found that hide-a-beds and sofa beds are usually heavier than we can manage. Please try to bring all rummage sale items no later than Wednesday morning, June 7, so that we can get them priced and displayed. What do we need? We are looking for clean clothes in good condition for men, women, and children in all sizes. It is especially helpful if the clothes are labeled for size. We sort by small, medium, large, and extra-large for men's, women's, boys' and girls' clothes. Other items that sell well include toys, games, puzzles, books, dishes, glassware, pots and pans, knickknacks, pictures, lamps, seasonal decorations, jewelry, clothing accessories, tools, sports equipment (no bowling balls or ski equipment!), household furnishings and small appliances. Bring only items that are reasonably clean and appliances that are in working order.

The sign-up sheets for helping with the preparations and the sale itself will be posted on the Opportunities Board by mid-May. Use this opportunity to have some fun and to get better acquainted with others in the church. A successful sale lets us do a lot of good for a great many people.


Don't hesitate to come by yourself. You won't be sitting alone for long. Be prepared for an uplifting evening of good Christian fellowship.

How are we coming along this year with our payments on the mortgage? Are we keeping up with our goal of paying it off in ten years? I sure would like to see the building paid for before I pass off this mortal coil!

Getting Along in Years

Dear Getting Along,

I'm with you and I'm still waiting for Bill Gates to notice the good work we are doing!

Last year we were able to pay enough additional principal to be on our way toward that goal. However, things have slowed down recently. For two of the first three months this year, contributions toward the mortgage weren't enough to pay even at the lower fifteen-year rate of \$11,361.33. Not to panic — we had enough in reserve to make those payments in full, on time. We also need to remember that money to the church does not come in evenly throughout the year. These winter months may just have been slow.

The members of our congregation are generous, but it is a changing congregation. We have lost a fairly large number of long-time members in the last couple of years especially, and long-time members tend to be more able to make larger regular gifts. We actually have a larger number of members making regular contributions than in years past, but more of our members are in their mid-family years when life is just more expensive. (And a younger congregation is good news!)

We can do this, but we need to keep our eyes on the goal. We need keep in mind both support of the ongoing ministries of our church and our goal of paying off this long-term debt. Please don't think I'm "crying wolf." There's no imminent danger of our going under. We just all should stay tuned in and to take any opportunity to find a few extra dollars every month if we want to get this done. We are firm in our belief that God will provide; but until Bill Gates takes notice, God is providing through what has been put in our pockets.


