

From the Pastor

“When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.”
Acts 2:1-4



On June 4, 50 days after Easter, we celebrate Pentecost and the fresh infusion of the Holy Spirit that gave the church the power to carry out Jesus' command to share the Good News of Jesus' death and resurrection to people everywhere. Willimon and Hauerwas, in the book *Holy Spirit*, write, “The Spirit continues to rest on Jesus's body only now that body turns out to be the church. The church, moreover, under the direction of the Spirit, has as its task—in word and deed—to point to Jesus.” (p. 38)

The church, that's you and me together, has the responsibility and privilege of pointing to Christ. We do that when we love and forgive others, whether or not they deserve it. We do that when we offer a free meal in celebration of the free gift of God's grace. We do that when we serve Christ with joy according to the gifts he has given us. We do that when we share with a hurting friend, how Jesus helped us through a tough time. We do that in hundreds of other ways as we work with God to build God's Kingdom.

Come on June 4th for one of our Pentecost worship services, wear red if you have it, and join the celebration, receive anew the power of the Spirit that we might be all we are called to be! Then join us for the annual church picnic at Braddock's Bay.

Also in June, we will celebrate the baptism of Iris Simonelli at the 11 am service on June 11. June 18 we will recognize fathers and graduates. And on June 25 we will celebrate the ministry of Tammy Ruiz as she retires from her role as Aldersgate's organist. See you in church!

Annual Rummage Sale Upon Us!

There are just a few days left to clear out all that extra “stuff” you’ve accumulated over the years and get it to our great annual “recycling event” – the Rummage Sale – coming up on **Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, June 8, 9, & 10**. Now is the time to clear out cupboards, closets, sheds and basements. Don’t forget to look for items that may just be sitting around in plain sight not being used.

Please try to **bring your donations no later than noon on Wednesday, June 7**. We would like to finish setting up for the sale by the end of that afternoon so that all the workers can get a good night’s rest before the sale begins. We are looking for clean **clothes in good condition, books, games, dishes and pans, household linens and accessories, toys, furniture, tools, etc.** We are often surprised at what does and doesn’t sell.

Please bring only items that are **clean** and appliances that are **in working order** and bring them in through the north doors of the Ide Center during the day. Keep in mind that **we do not take hideabeds**. As useful as they are, they are too heavy for most of us to move. Also, please **don’t bring bowling balls or ski equipment**. Neither seems to sell and no one will pick them up except the trash company – for a charge.

If you need help with larger items, please call the church office by May 31. We will try to make arrangements for pickup. If any of you have trailers, vans, or trucks and could **help with pickup**, please let us know, also.

The hours of the sale will be as follows: **Thursday and Friday from 9:00 AM – 6:00 PM and Saturday (the Bag Sale) from 9:00 AM – Noon**.

We need your help with sorting and pricing the incoming donations and with staffing each day of the sale. We’ll be working from 9:00 AM till 4:00 PM every day except Sunday. The sign-up sheet has just morning and afternoon shifts, but come even if you only have an hour or two to



help on any given day. We never seem to run out of work. Please note that on **Monday and Tuesday, June 5 & 6**, we will have **evening work** hours from 6:30 – 9:00 PM if some of you sign up in advance.

People are needed to come in promptly at **noon on Saturday to help clean** up. We will also pack up the clothing to take to the St. Pauly’s collection box at Greece UMC to benefit our Greece Habitat project. We need those of you with pickups and vans again to help take the rest of the leftover items to the Goodwill Store. We’d like to be cleared out by 1:30 PM so that we can all rest up for Sunday!

We also need your fine baked goods. Our bake sales have become a significant “profit center” with regular customers! The sign-up sheet has space for **fresh goods Thursday and Friday**. Pies, cakes, cookies, brownies, fudge, cupcakes, breads, and homemade candy all sell well. We sell goodies like cookies and brownies packaged by the dozen, half-dozen, or pairs. **Please label your baked goods** so that we know what kind of cookies, etc. we are selling and if the recipe includes nuts. If you can deliver your baked goods to the church kitchen Wednesday night or early Thursday or Friday, we will have the widest opportunity to sell them.

Where does the money go? Half is used to support the mission projects of the UMW. Not only do we support national and international mission work through out annual Pledge to Mission, we also donate to local ministries, such as Mission Share, Greece Food Shelf, and our church Christmas White Gifts program. The other half this year will go toward paying down principle on the church mortgage.

Get on board! The Rummage Sale is a lot of work, but it’s also a lot of fun and a great way to get acquainted. See you there!

Mission News

Second Quarter Food Drive Set

Families whose children normally get free/reduced price lunches at school struggle to put enough food on the table for three meals in the summer. Many seniors have difficulty making their pension/social security checks last the whole month. People who are no longer eligible for unemployment assistance but don't yet have jobs need help. These are just three of the situations encountered by those who seek help at the Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf in the summer.

Our next major **Food** for Friends Drive is scheduled for June 18, Father's Day. Grocery bags will be distributed the Sunday before to remind you to make an extra effort. Among the items suggested are the following: canned fruit and fruit juice, canned meat and vegetables, soup, peanut butter, jelly, spaghetti sauce, large boxed mashed potatoes, ramen noodles, pudding, Jell-O, boxed cake and cookie mixes, macaroni and cheese are all important to our neighbors who are having a hard time putting food on the table for their families.

Money donations help the Food Shelf buy fresh food like meat, milk, and bread. If you prefer, you may write a check to *Aldersgate UMC* designated for "Greece Food Shelf" or put cash in an envelope so marked. If we all make the effort to bring a bag of groceries or make an extra donation, we will make a big difference in the lives of our neighbors.


CROP Walk Benefits Food Shelf

The preliminary results are in from the 2017 Crop Walk on May 7. **A total of \$7,236** was collected as of May 11, of which **\$1,222 came from Aldersgate. Twenty-five percent** of that goes to the **Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf** to fund food distributed locally, and the remainder will be sent to Church World Service to help hungry people around the world.

Several of the participating churches increased the total they collected significantly by taking advantage of the opportunity to make online pledges. We did receive \$25 of our total through an online pledge; but we may be able to grow our contributions in future years by emphasizing that option, especially since more people are becoming accustomed to giving by that method.

Return Baby Bottles Father's Day

Baby bottles you picked up at the Mother - Daughter Banquet or after should be returned **on** June 18 filled with the change you collected for **Crossroads** Pregnancy Care, a service offered by **Mission: Share**. There will be a basket on the Ushers' Table just inside the door of the sanctuary in which to place them. Your support will be very much appreciated by the mothers and babies who receive Crossroads services.



Red Bird Seeks New Minivan with Labels for Education

When Patricia & Alma Harmer called Red Bird Mission recently with questions about mailing the Campbell Soup Company UPC's and the General Mills Boxtops for Education collected here at Aldersgate, they were greeted with enthusiasm. This United Methodist Church Mission in Eastern Kentucky is once again hoping to collect enough from these two sources to purchase a new minivan for their work. (Some of you may remember that in the early '90s Red Bird collected enough Campbell's labels to purchase small passenger vans – like our Aldersgate van – to transport their mountain children to school. The program was so successful that at first Campbell's extended the offer of vans for a few years just for Red Bird before they finally ended that project. The Red Bird representatives were delighted that the Harmers were preparing to send about **2000 Campbell's UPCs and 1500 Box Tops for Education** from Aldersgate.

Keep up the good work! Please continue to put the UPCs and Labels in the green box on the Mission Counter in the Gathering Space. It's a cost-free way to continue to support children at the Red Bird Christian School in an impoverished area our country.

Dear Sally Stewardship

Dear Sally,

We are about midway through the year. How are our church finances doing?

Just Curious

Dear Curious,

I'm glad you asked. We continue to be thankful for God's provisions for us. Our congregation really seems to be cheerfully supporting our programs, outreach, and mortgage repayment to an extent we would never have believed even just a few years before we built our extended facilities. However, right now, in a month-to-month comparison with last year, we are coming up short. As of May 11, \$56,844 had been contributed to the Building Fund in 2016 compared to \$50,822 in 2017. (One difference is that we were conducting the renewal campaign for mortgage repayment and the topic was foremost in front of us.) Contributions to Current Expense, which supports our ongoing ministries—pastor, facilities, Christian Education, etc.—in 2016 totaled \$117,857 as of that date but \$114,422 in 2017. That's not a huge gap, but we have had some especially heavy expenses for which we have had to stretch out payments. We are also struggling to keep up as close as we can with our payments toward Ministry Shares—our portion of supporting our denominational ministries.

Frankly we are concerned but not yet alarmed. However, gaps like this without some change are accumulative. As a member of the congregation you are right

to ask how we are doing. You expect us to be paying salaries, utilities, and other bills on time. I'm sure that you also don't want our Financial Secretary and our Treasurers to suffer from permanent high blood pressure.

What can we do? First, pray specifically about our church finances. God often answers in unexpected ways. Pray, too, about our own giving. We often feel quite pressed to pay our own bills but overlook ways we can step up. God calls us to respond generously and that readiness with a response proportionate to the resources God has given us is a sign of our spiritual health. Whether it is the small coin dropped in the offering by the widow, who Jesus said gave all she had, or the larger contributions some of us are able to make, it is our commitment as a community to carry out God's work that makes ministry possible.

For inspiration read again II Corinthians 8 & 9, the Apostle Paul's model for financing the work of the early church. Note especially verses 7-8 in Chapter 9: "Everyone should give whatever they have decided in their heart. They shouldn't give with hesitation or because of pressure. God loves a cheerful giver. God has the power to provide you with more than enough of every kind of grace. That way, you will have everything you need always and in everything to provide more than enough for every kind of good work." Let that be our guide, and . . .
