





Report on June's Annual Conference

When I was first asked several years ago to be Aldersgate's lay member to attend the Upper New York Conference, I cheerfully said 'Yes", and then went home and went online to find out what the Upper New York Conference was. We are a Conference, going to a conference? Huh?

Now I know that the world-wide United Methodist Church is divided into jurisdictions (kind of like states), which are divided into annual conferences (like counties), which are further divided into districts. Aldersgate UMC is in the Northeastern jurisdiction, in the Upper New York Annual Conference, in the Genesee Valley district. And every year, annual conferences meet together in a central location to hear committee reports, vote on resolutions, and do other important things. Every year I am blown away by the sight of one thousand United Methodists gathered in one place; singing, smiling, eating, hugging, worshiping and voting. As always, the four days were filled with a mixture of the routine (committee reports, budgets), amusing (the bishop wearing a Dr. Seuss hat), the frustrating (amendments to the amendments to the resolutions) and the wonderful (the music, the singing, the preaching and the lifting up of those retiring, passed on, or dedicating their lives to ministry).

Here are a few of the highlights:

- Christine Mitchell was appointed as part-time local pastor to Honeoye Falls United Methodist.
- Upper New York now has 98 New Faith Communities. Over the course of the session, \$5,600 was raised toward that vital mission. As a result, Bishop Webb had his picture taken wearing a Dr. Seuss hat!
- The attendees were treated to two sermons given by Rev. Dr. Vance Ross, pastor of Central UMC in Atlanta, GA. His video is on the website; I highly recommend it!
- A report from Church Mutual, our insurance company, included a mention that there will be a raise in premiums thanks to two church fires in the past year.
- There were fourteen churches in Upper New York that closed over the past year, including Grace UMC and West Ave UMC in Rochester. The buildings will be sold, with the proceeds going to the new faith ministries.

- We elected 12 people as delegates to either 2020 General Conference or Jurisdictional Conference. Half of these are clergy, the other half laity, with two of the twelve people reserves.
- We considered 13 petitions and resolutions, with 8 passing.
- You can check the website, <u>http://www.unyumc.org</u> for details and videos!

The theme of the conference was "Together in Prayer-Moving Beyond Our Comfort Zones". With the results of the Special Session last February, it is likely that there will be changes coming to the entire denomination, and Aldersgate will need to educate itself on the possibilities, and immerse ourselves in prayer, in order to be prepared to make the best decisions. To begin the process, you are invited to meet with Pastor Sung Ho, Jan Rothfuss, Pastor Hector and myself on Sunday, July 14 at 4:30 to discuss the results of the Special Session held last February in St Louis regarding human sexuality, along with the resolutions just passed at annual conference. Along with information, we will all have a chance to share our concerns and ask questions- although there will most likely not be any answers until the next General Conference in 2020. However, this is a journey we need to take together as members of Aldersgate, and all of our voices need to be heard. We hope to see you there!

The room has not been kept up in recent times but is now up and running. There is still a staffed nursery on Sundays from 9:00 until 12:30 and the Quiet Room is not meant to be a nursery or playroom. No children should be in there at anytime without one of their parents and is designed for use of the parents with their infants. We would appreciate any feedback and/or suggestions.

"UN-GROW UP!"

Mark 10:15 "Whomever doesn't receive the Kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it."

It seems like all our kids want to do is to be "Grown-Up." It's even a "command" we give to those we don't think are acting "right:" "Oh, Grow Up!"

Several years ago, though, I spent 18 months as a Preschool Teacher's Aide, in a 3-year-olds classroom and I learned more from them than I ever taught them. I learned that I had a lot of "Un-Growing Up" to do!

The first lesson came immediately, in how they welcomed me. I was, certainly, a different age than all of them and a different race than most and yet they all wanted a spot on my lap and to introduce themselves all at the same time. And it wasn't just like that the first day. It was like that all year. It was not in their nature to be un-welcoming or to discriminate!

The second lesson came from a policy that made "sense" to the grown-ups. If one child had a crying fit, upon arrival or when transitioning between activities, we would gently separate them and let them cry it out, and move on to the next activity. The rest of the children had difficulty "ignoring" that other child, though. It was not in their nature to not show compassion for one who was hurting.

The third lesson came from a major change that came in the middle of the year. Two Preschools were combining. Ours was closing for renovations. The students would go to a new building. Only two would be together, with one teacher they knew, combined into existing classrooms with a new teacher and classmates. We expected fear and anxiety, and got it from their parents, and felt it ourselves, but the kids were Great! As long as a teacher would be with them, they were fine with facing anything!
