Happy 2020!

The Trustees have some news that we'd like to share.

- We are asking for help to maintain our church. Please be willing to share your talents and skills to maintain our buildings. People worked so hard to build it - let's maintain it!
- We are working on priority tasks like the handicap accessible door and air curtain. We hope to have it all installed by the end of February. There will be some adjustments people will need to make when it is installed, but in the long run it will benefit many people.
- The floor scrubber is back! It had been gone for over a month in order to get an overhaul and tune up. This is a machine that would cost several thousand brand new, so it's important that we keep it maintained. Our custodian Jean Paul is happy to have it functioning again!
- We have continued our organization night each month. A new sign-up is on the bulletin board. Always the third Tuesday of the month from 5:30-8:00 PM. Along with organizing, we get to meet new people and socialize! January was the office area and February is the Fellowship Hall kitchen!
- The kitchen door lock is fixed! Thank you to Mark DeVincentis and Bob Thayer! Thank you to Ray Poling for adding the kick stands to each of the doors since we think that may have caused the initial problem! If we had a locksmith come to do it, it would have cost more than \$400. Thank you to the men who saved the church money.
- A list of major tasks has been developed to have Sue Zorn and Jan Winter look into possible grants for us. One of the items is to get new thermostats in the older parts of the building. This would help regulate the heat as well as conserve money that we spend every month on the RGE bill. These thermostats and all the work to install them is estimated to cost about \$17,000. More to come on these!
- The nominating committee will be looking for volunteers to be a Trustee starting in April. We thank those who are leaving for serving the Church in this capacity.

Do Good NOW!!

As I'm writing this, it's New Year's Eve, about to usher in 2020! Lately I've been seeing these "Facebook ads" asking you to choose a "word" for 2020. I don't really have a "word," but after reading the "Watch Night" Scriptures, I have a phrase: 'Do Good NOW!'

There's a 'Buzz phrase' that we've heard in other election seasons, and likely will again: 'The enemy of Progress.' Well, there is a Basic enemy to Basic Progress, it's Pro-crastination! Nothing will ever get done if we keep saying we'll 'do it later.'

John Wesley had an edict of sorts that I like. With all due respect to Wesley, though, I think he added too many qualifiers that make the quote confusing. I am simply going to use the beginning of Wesley's quote, with one qualifier he didn't include, as an 'edict' of sorts for myself, and a suggestion for us all, moving forward in 2020: 'Do ALL the Good YOU can, and DO IT NOW!'

One of the Watch Night Scriptures was the familiar Ecclesiastes: 'A time to be born and a time to die.' Well; with scheduling of inducing or C-Sections, when medically necessary, it is possible for a doctor to say: "Your baby will be born on 'this' date." As far as the other end, what day

someone will die, not so much! So; since we don't know when WE won't have a 'later,' or the person we're meant to reach out to won't have a 'later,' Do Good NOW!

The other Scripture for Watch Night was Revelation: 'New Heaven and New Earth' and, while we know that ALL of that becoming reality won't happen until 'later,' I don't think Jesus would have included in the Model Prayer: 'Thy Kingdom come, Thy Will be done' if He didn't mean for it to at least start becoming a reality NOW! But that's something God will do through us! We, individually, may think we can't do anything BIG to 'change the world,' but we can do small things that change someone's world! Exciting Update about Ebenezer Hope Ministries Safe Water Project.

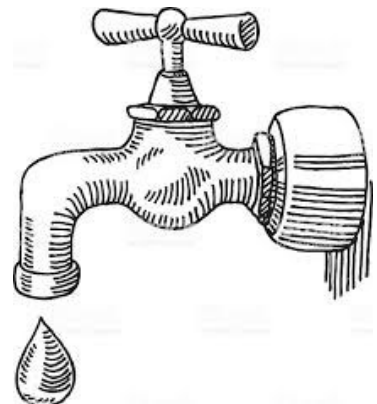
Late November, I received word from the Pastors in Nakivale Refugee Settlement who received water purification filter systems that were supplied by donations from Aldersgate UMC members.

You may remember that Aldersgate's donations purchased 14 systems and training, and the manufacturer matched our donations with 14 more systems in a program with faith based organizations they named "Wine into Water."

Those purification systems in Nakivale Camp had been in use for 10 months by November. The Pastors reported that these systems' safe drinking water is a Bright Light in the lives of the Refugees who have access to them. To have some safe drinking water reliably available without having to boil it, if fuel - wood scraps - were available, is a wonderful gift to those persons. You are praised by those refugees for the gift of safe water you have given them!

And the Medical Compound has safe water during the dry season, for the 300 to 400 patients they see each day, because of the nine systems your gifts donated to them. The Pastors pass their Thanks and Blessings on to you for this special gift you have presented to the refugees.

We are hoping to have children sing a beautiful song in Church on Sunday, February 23rd. There will be more information given out in Sunday School this month.

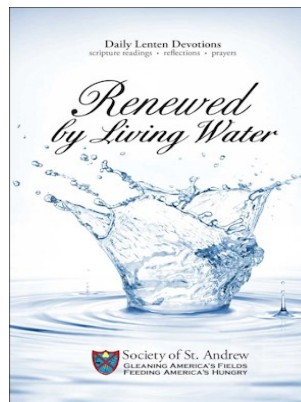


SAVE THE DATE!

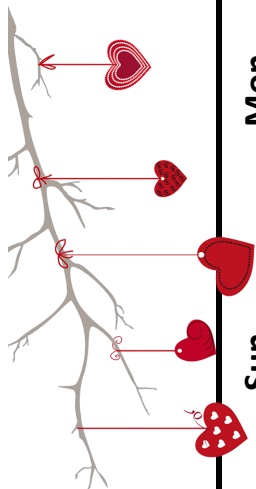

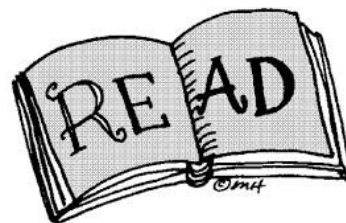
