



The Joyous Circle of Life

As I am writing this; I, just this morning, witnessed the first cries of my grandson, as nurses cleaned up, swaddled him and laid him in his Mother's arms, minutes after he took his first 'earthly' breath. I am quite mindful, though that tomorrow marks two years to the day that, in another part of that same hospital, I witnessed nurses taking out the tube that marked the failed attempt to resuscitate, an hour after my Father had breathed his last earthly breath.

They seem like polar opposites, beginning and ending, life and death. And yet funerals are known as Celebrations of Life! That's because as Christians, leaning on our Faith, we know that these events are not real opposites at all! So we try, hard as it may be, to be as Joyful about the going out as we are about the coming in!

And while it will always be hard, we can approach that same Joy because we know, through our Faith, that this 'earthly' life is NOT all there is! My Grandson was conceived in the Mind and Heart of God long before he was conceived in his Mother's womb! And after my Father breathed his last earthly breath, he went back to that same God, and the Perfection of Heaven! God's Constant, Caring Presence, makes both events, and every day in-between, a cause for Joy and Celebration!

Ironically, or maybe not so ironically, the same "gifts" are given — at least those brought to the Maternity Ward or the Funeral Home — to mark both events: flowers, balloons and cards. The cards for one have words of Joy while for the other have words of Comfort. But I seem to recall that in a song written to commemorate another Very Special Baby Boy's birth (and life, death and resurrection) linked Comfort and Joy together as gifts we will receive if we, even in the dark times, lean on Him!

The Apostle Paul tells us to find Joy in ALL circumstances! That's not easy to do sometimes. But if certain things were 'easy,' or human nature, they wouldn't need to be 'commands,' now would they?! Like finding red or blue wild flowers in a sea of green grasses, though, with God's help, it's possible, and worth the effort!

Some of you are going through dark times. My advice: Keep Going! Keep searching for the Joy! It is there! Just as sure as in almost every field of green grasses there are beautiful wild flowers! And as we enter the homestretch of the somewhat 'dark' season of Lent; repenting of our sinfulness, 'giving up' some of our favorite things, I say again; Keep Going! Easter's coming, and the Prize of a deeper relationship with God through Christ is both possible and SO worth it!
