From the Pastor

Reopening...

New York's statewide stay-at-home order went into effect 8 p.m. Sunday, March 22 to curb the spread of COVID-19, the disease caused by the coronavirus. It changed our lives.

The photo was taken on Latta Road in the morning of March 19. It was supposed to be busy with traffic. But on that morning, it looked like a ghost town. It was eerie. The Coronavirus has changed the world.

Two months have passed since then. We are still very vulnerable to the Coronavirus. The situation has not changed much. But now I am surprised at what has happened to me for the past two months. Now I don't have the weird feeling that I had two months ago while driving. I have adjusted somewhat to this new normal. Yes, I don't still feel safe from the Coronavirus in public setting.

What I want to say is, reopening has begun outside and inside of me as well. Life is moving forward, neither stagnant nor backward. The church is moving forward, too, to return to in-person worship. But I want to make it clear that our utmost priority is that we return with safety and ease of transition. It cannot be done by pastor only or several church leaders. It is the work of all the people of Aldersgate Church.

I hope you agree with me that we can't all rush back to church and pick up where we left off. It's not going to happen. Or at least it *shouldn't* happen. We need to think and plan carefully. However, we are people of faith. Let us live by faith and not operate in fear, but let's also be proactive towards all, especially those who are most vulnerable to COVID-19.


There are things that we must think about before we reopen the church:

- We need a plan for sanitizing the church building.
- We also need instructions and guidelines for worship services – ushers, bulletin, offering plate, hymn singing, choir, communion, coffee hour, etc.

Communication is also very important. So, we will continue to share any update with you.

Let us join together in praying for reopening with excitement, hope and trust in God. I will continue to pray that God may keep you safe and well.

FACING THE STRANGE CHANGES

Pardon me, but I am going to begin this Devotional as I began the last, talking about my new Grandbaby! In just 2 months, as I'm writing this, he's already changed so much! He's gained 3 pounds and grown 4 inches. He's holding his head up well, reaching for and grabbing things, and learning to sit up. There have been some hardships, mostly for his Mom, going through a hard labor, dealing with nursing issues and trying to get him on a sleep schedule. I tried to "warn her" about some of that, but those are "strange changes" (unique, not really explainable), that each new Mom has to adjust to and work through. But she is adjusting, and he is thriving!

In those same 2 months, almost to the day, our nation, began to go through some REALLY strange changes. (Our whole world, really, but other countries shut down before we did.) The day my grandson went home from the hospital was the last time I "hugged" my Pastor. The following week was the last time we stepped foot in our beautiful Sanctuary! Even if there were people old enough to remember the Spanish Flu of 100 years ago that this is being compared to, these are indeed "strange" changes, unique to each person, not really explainable. And we've found ways of coping that weren't available 100, or even 30, years ago! While I do truly feel horrible for the HUGE numbers of lost lives, and their families, many of us, at least that I've heard from, are not among those and, while there have been some struggles, we're adjusting.

And do you know why we're adjusting; why life is going on even amidst so much death? It's because we have one "constant" that NEVER changes: The Love, Mercy and Wisdom of God! No matter who dies, or how many, no matter who we can't be around for a while; God Never dies and He is Always around, if we just look for Him. Now God is always moving, always evolving, always creating. That's why we have so much they didn't have 100 years ago. That's why our Pastor and church leaders had the inspiration and know-how to keep us worshipping together and tithing remotely. (And THANK YOU to all of them for making it possible!) But the most important aspects of God, His Love, Mercy and Wisdom, will NEVER change!

I pray we will be together, in person, soon! Until then; I leave you with 2 fitting verses that help carry me through tough times: **"God makes ALL things work together for Good for those who love Him and are called by His Name." (Romans 8:28) & "I know the Plans I have for you, says The Lord. Plans to Prosper and not harm you. Plans for Hope and a Future." (Jeremiah 29:11)** If you will turn to God, He will "Turn to face the strange changes" with you and carry you through them.




Plant a Pizza Garden/Patch for Dad this Father's Day!

- Blunt scissors (Round tips only. No plastic scissors.)
- Box of 24 crayons (Only 24-count boxes are accepted.)
- One-subject notebooks (No marble composition books. No 3 or 5-subject notebooks.)
- Pack of loose-leaf paper (100-200 page packets are acceptable. Wide or college rule accepted.)
- Hand-held pencil sharpeners (1-inch or longer)
- Rulers (12 inches long)
- Unsharpened pencils
- Eraser - Two inches or larger
- Two-gallon re-sealable plastic bags

Hygiene Kit Items

- Hand towels (15 x 25 – 17 x 27 inches) (No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels)
- Washcloths
- Combs (Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth. No pocket combs or picks or Rattail.)
- Toenail or fingernail clippers (No emery boards or metal nail files.)
- Bath-size soaps (3 oz. bar or larger) (No Ivory or Jergen's)
- Adult toothbrushes (Do not remove from packaging. Personal advertising not acceptable.)
- Adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)
- One-gallon size re-sealable bags
