From the Pastor

Back to Church

We will be back to church in August. We will reopen the church. It is not really "reopening" because our church has never been closed. It was the doors and the building that were closed. Worship service, Sunday School, prayer ministry, small groups, caring ministry, outreach ministries and committee meetings have never been stopped. Thank you so much for being so active in ministry in these difficult times.

So it is not really reopening. I would say it is relaunching — doing the same thing in new ways, in different ways. As we resume worship service in-person, we will do worship service in ways different from the way we did before the Coronavirus pandemic — wearing masks, social distancing and so on. Our hope is to go back to the old normal. But we don't know when. We may not be able to return to the old normal. But don't be disappointed.

I hope you remember the promise that came from God to prophet Isaiah.

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." Isaiah 43:19

What an exciting news! God is about to do a new thing for Aldersgate Church. I want to know what God has for us in His mind? It must be a very exciting plan. I want to be a part of His vision. How about you? I hope you are very excited as well about His plan for us. I hope you also want to join God in doing great things for Aldersgate Church.

Survey Update from Aldersgate's Re-Launch/Re-Opening Task Force

Thank you to all who participated in our recent church survey! The Task Force received information which has been very helpful as plans are made to bring everyone back to church safely.

Just a few highlights from the survey which may be interesting to you:

- ♦ A total of 189 surveys were mailed out and 87 surveys were returned. Thirty eight (38) surveys were received from folks who indicate they attend the 9:30am service and forty nine (49) surveys were received from folks who say they regularly attend the 11:00am service.
- ♦ These surveys represent approximately 166 people.
- Of all respondents, only 9 people indicated they had been tested for Covid 19, and none tested positive.
- Sixty two (62) of the 166 respondents indicated they consider themselves in a vulnerable population.
- Over half of the 166 respondents indicated they would feel comfortable returning to church once any stay-at-home orders (observing CDC and NYS guidelines) are lifted.

- Sixty three (63) percent of respondents ranked the following as "Very Important" or "Important":
 - Socially distanced seating,
 - Greeters not shaking hands,
 - Sanitizer available,
 - Masks required, and
 - Communion not offered in the typical fashion
- Seventy seven (77) percent of respondents agree that different aspects of our worship service may need to be phased in. (Communion, Singing, Children's Time, Collection of offering)
- Eighty one (81) percent of respondents indicated they would like to see the option of online worship continue, even after in-sanctuary worship has resumed
- ♦ To the question "if you have worshipped online during the past months what has been your experience", eighty five (85) percent of respondents stated Aldersgate's online worship "Exceeded or Met" their expectations. Thirteen (13) percent of respondents indicated they had not worshipped online.

Church Re-Opening Plan — Page 1

To our Brothers and Sisters of Aldersgate United Methodist Church,

It is with great joy that we announce our plan to restart in-person Worship services on Sunday, August 2, 2020. We are proceeding with utmost caution and firmly within the guidelines from both the State of New York and the UNY Conference.

John Wesley stressed both the centrality of community in the life of the church but also established 'do no harm' as a primary practice of faithful living. We seek to balance these two values as we plan to resume in-person gatherings for worship, education, fellowship, leadership and community outreach.

We will be taking a phased approach to opening our church with the first phase of resuming limited in-person Worship. Plans are also being made for when potentially other practices vital to our church and community will be able to be resumed.

Please read carefully the following information and guidelines that have been established so you know what to expect for Sunday services.

- We will hold one Worship service from 10:00 10:45 a.m. on Sunday, August 2, in the Sanctuary. The African community will hold their service from 1:00 – 2:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary.
- The 10:00 service will be streamed live on Facebook as well as taped and posted on Facebook for those who cannot attend in person.

If you are included in the at-risk population, are immunocompromised, cannot wear a mask for extended periods, work in essential services such as health care or skilled nursing facilities, or do not feel comfortable attending in-person, please continue to shelter in place and engage with the online service at this time.

 Please plan on arriving no earlier than 15 minutes before the services starts. Wait in your car until you see the doors to the church open. Maintain a distance of 6 feet from other families as you enter the church. If you cannot maintain that distance, then please put on your mask in the parking lot. Just before entering the church you will see a sign that poses the 3 COVID-19 questions. If you answer 'Yes' to any of these questions, we lovingly ask that you not enter the church and worship online from home.

In the past 14 days have you:

- ◆ Tested Positive for COVID-19?
- ♦ Had COVID-19 symptoms?
- ◆ Had close contact with someone with COVID-19?
- Wearing a mask that covers your nose and mouth will be <u>mandatory</u> to enter the church and must continue to be worn the entire time you are in the building, as well as any other time you cannot maintain a distance of 6 feet from others.
- There will be hand sanitizer available as you enter the church, and we ask that you sanitize your hands as you enter, and again as you leave the church.
- We need to keep track of everyone who attends, for potential tracing purposes. Please give your name to the Greeter so they can check your attendance on the log.
- The Nursery will <u>not</u> be open, and there will be no inperson Sunday school for children or adults. Children over the age of 2 will need to wear a mask and must stay with their families at all times.
- If you have any God sightings, Joys or Prayer requests, you can email them to Pastor Lee prior to each week's service, or there will be someone at the Welcome table with a card you can fill out. These will be handed to Pastor Lee prior to the service.
- An usher will guide you and your family to an appropriate seat in the Sanctuary. Families will be seated together, and we will maintain a distance of 6 feet apart. This means that most likely you will not be able to sit in your regular spot. We appreciate your understanding and flexibility.
- Masks that cover your nose and mouth must be worn during the entire service.
- While there will be appropriate worshipful music, any soloists or readers will be wearing face shields and will be at least 6 feet from anyone else. We know that this is heartbreaking, but the risk of spreading COVID-19 from singing is very high. You may hum along to any songs or hymns, but we will not have any congregational singing at this time.

- The Quiet room will be available with a chair and a changing table if it's needed. Sanitizing wipes will be available and will need to be used to wipe down what you use.
- The Family Bathroom that is next to the Nursery will be available for use during or after the service.
- There will be no bulletins printed at this time. The order of the service will be displayed on the projection screens so you can follow.
- We will not be passing the offering basket. There will be an Offering Basket located at the back of the Sanctuary by the entrance/exit to put your offering.

We encourage Online giving, either by credit card, automatic bank transfer, or EFT. Please contact Jan Winter at 943-7353 for help in setting up one of these options.

- There will be no food or beverages provided before or after service, and we are sorry, but no socializing after service will be allowed in the building.
- Ushers will release each row one at a time at the end of the service to allow for every family to exit the church and maintain a distance of 6 feet apart.

Significant measures have been taken to clean and sanitize the areas we will be using initially.

- We have purchased a mist sanitizing machine that will be used to clean all the surfaces in the Gathering Space, Sanctuary, Family bathroom, and Quiet Room. These areas, and the Office are currently the only areas open to anyone in the church.
- These areas will be cleaned and sanitized after each service.
- All other areas of the church will be closed for now.
- Hand sanitizer will be available and will be encouraged to be used.
- All hymnals, Bibles, pens, envelopes, etc. have been removed from the chair pockets.

Please know that we realize and have considered how difficult this is and how awkward it may feel. The good news is that this won't last forever, and that God is with us every step of the way, as we all work to ensure the health and safety of everyone who enters our doors.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I don't have a mask?

Let the Greeter know, and one will be provided to you.

What if I don't want to or can't wear a mask over my nose and mouth?

Then we lovingly ask you to continue to worship from home online.

What is coming in the next phase?

Provided the spread of the virus continues to be low or continues to reduce, we are planning on adding Children's time, Acolytes and Communion on Aug 16th. For Communion we are ordering single packets for the elements that will be passed out to each person.

When will we go back to two services?

Right now, we are planning for this to happen on September 13, along with the African community starting to use the Chapel, Children and Youth in-person Sunday school, and the Nursery open to children. Further communication will be coming as we are able to firm up these plans or need to push them out.

What about meetings in the church? For the rest of 2020 and most likely into 2021, all church meetings will continue to be held via Zoom. The effort to clean and sanitize any area that has been used is huge, so we need to minimize that as much as we can. We have been very successful meeting via Zoom and can continue to do so.

What about the Community Dinner?
Current plans are to have the first Take-Out Community
Dinner on the last Saturday in August. This event will
need to continue to be Take Out until we have guid-

I assume that is true also for Church events, dinners, and other activities.

ance that large indoor gatherings are safe.

Yes, we will not be planning anything at least until sometime in 2021.




