From the Pastor

On August 2, we had in-person worship for the first time since we closed the church on March 15th. Thanks be to God! The worship service was also live streamed and recorded so that people may join in worship any time. 49 people joined in worship in person and 435 people viewed and joined in worship online. On August 9th, 62 people joined in worship in-person and 268 people joined in worship online.

The first Communion was celebrated on August 16. And the first Community Dinner will be held on August 29 with drive-through only. We will continue to expand our ministry. However, don't forget that safety is our top priority. I truly believe God will lead and guide us as we continue to expand our ministry.

However, we need to think about the direction and vision for both our personal lives and the church in the current situation. Let me share with you some data to show our reality.

The numbers of daily average new COVID-19 cases and deaths in Monroe County:

Month	New Cases/Day	Deaths/Day
March	18	0.5
April	37	3.5
May	47	3.4
June	24	1.7
July	29	0.4
August	28	0.3

As you see in the table, COVID-19 was most active and reached the peak in April and May. The number of deaths has significantly decreased in July and August. However, the number of new cases has continued to be steady for the past three months around 24-29. I really hope it decreases, but it may not as fall and winter approach. It could be a new normal at least for now. So, what should our strategic plan be for our personal lives and for the church?

I want to share what God said to Isaiah:

The desert and the parched land will be glad; the wilderness will rejoice and blossom. Like the crocus, it will burst into bloom; it will rejoice greatly and shout for joy. The glory of Lebanon will be given to it, the splendor of Carmel and Sharon; they will see the glory of the LORD, the splendor of our God. Strengthen the feeble hands, steady the knees that give way; say to those with fearful hearts, "Be strong, do not fear; your God will come, he will come with vengeance; with divine retribution he will come to save you." (Isaiah 35:1-4)

That's what God will do for us. Be strong and do not fear. Be ready for His coming. Let us be prepared. I believe God has already started His work of recovery. Let us join Him in His new movement of growing and expanding. However, don't forget the importance of safety.

Whichever Way This Goes

As I'm writing this, it's early August. I just celebrated my wedding anniversary. But that date marks another "anniversary" as well, the anniversary of the passing of a good friend from cancer, 6 years this month. I remember, during his final week, his family members were there a lot more, which is expected but left me trying to find comforting words. Finally, God gave me these words:

"If there's one thing I know about your brother, he's walking with The Lord. Whichever way this goes...If God calls him Home tonight, he'll be walking with The Lord. If he lingers like this (basically unconscious by this point) for a few days or even weeks longer, he'll be walking with The Lord. Or if God somehow bodily heals him and he leaves that bed and this hospital, he'll be walking with The Lord!"

While most of us are not handling anything quite that dire, many of us have concerns about "which way things are going to go," with a medical test, a legal matter or the reopening of school or work in the midst of this pandemic. However, if we're walking with The Lord, we can rest assured that "whichever way this goes," "God will work all things together for our Good." (Romans 8:28)

So, keep walking with The Lord and, in the midst of whatever comes, you can keep stepping forward in Faith!

Reminder to All Persons Entering the Church for Business or Weekly Worship

Face masks must be worn at all times in the church. A face mask is made of at least 2-ply material (either homemade or purchased) and must firmly cover the nose and mouth. The blue/yellow ones used by healthcare professionals and in doctor/dentist offices are also acceptable. Bandanas and neck gaiters are not acceptable as a mask as they don't fit firmly around the mouth, and the masks with the one-way exhalation valves are also not effective protection and do not meet our current standards. The plastic face shields, either full or partial, require social distancing of 12-16 feet in ALL directions. At Aldersgate, only the Pastor or those singing will be allowed to wear face shields, and only during the times that they are in front and at least 12-16 feet from anyone else. All other times they are required to wear masks. Scripture readers will be required to wear their mask during the reading since they are less than 6' from the Pastor and share the lectern space with him. We take the health and safety of all persons in our church seriously and so, respectfully, ask that everyone entering our building follow this guideline. Face masks are available at the church and can also be provided by the Greeters on Sunday morning.



- Hand-held pencil sharpeners (1-inch or longer)
- Rulers (12 inches long)
- Unsharpened pencils
- Eraser Two inches or larger
- Two-gallon re-sealable plastic bags

Hygiene Kit Items

- Hand towels (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches) (No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels)
- Washcloths
- Combs (Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth. No pocket combs or picks or Rattail.)
- Toenail or fingernail clippers

 (No emery boards or metal nail files.)
- Bath-size soaps (3 oz. bar or larger) (No Ivory or Jergen's)
- Adult toothbrushes (Do not remove from packaging. Personal advertising not acceptable.)
- Adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)
- One-gallon size re-sealable bags
