Writers Needed

If you were asked to think of one word that describes how you feel about living in the Coronavirus Pandemic? I think many people would say, "Stressed." That's what I hear a lot when I called Aldersgate people – "I am OK. Stressed. Hanging in there."

Recently Dr. Fauci, the nation's top infectious disease doctor, sounded an alarm. He said, "We're all still in danger of catching COVID-19. I just think we need to hunker down and get through this fall and winter, because it's not going to be easy."

Hunker down. That's what we must do to protect us from Coronavirus. But when you hunker down, you are like a spring that is compressed or squeezed. You will get stressed. Dr. Fauci is saying your life will be like a compressed spring through this fall and winter. We must relieve stress, otherwise, we will suffer from the heavy pressure of the chronic stress.

What do you do to relieve stress? Let me tell you what I do. I have morning devotions every day. That's helpful for me to focus on faith, which helps me find purpose and strength with hope. I also run 2-3 miles in the afternoon 3-4 times a week. Physical exercise is a very good way to relieve stress.

So I encourage you to do both spiritual exercise and physical exercise daily. You may want to use daily devotionals such as the Upper Room, which you can pick up at the church.

I also encourage you to join in worship either in-person or online regularly. If neither of them works for you, please read the sermon which is emailed and also mailed to those who don't do emails. The act of worship with praise songs, prayers and hearing the word of God invites you to engage actively in fellowship with God and with each other so that you can lift up your stress to God and receive new strength and fresh spirit of life.

We also need a long-term plan in addition to daily and weekly routines as we need to hunker down through this fall and winter. We need hope for this winter. Otherwise, it is going to be a really long winter. Here is the good news! I am already excited. Jesus is coming! Jesus will bring love, peace, joy and hope. Christmas is always special. But this year it will be more special. I am already in the Advent spirit. I am stress-free as my heart is filled with the excitement, joy and hope of Christmas.

Pledge Payments and Donations


Several options continue for anyone unable to attend in-person worship services who wish to send money to the church:

- The new sound booth wood was sealed by Adam Pfund; carpet is on the list to be done as well.



Not much about 2020 has been normal. And nowhere have we seen that more starkly than the church. In March we suspended in-person worship (and all activities) – an unimaginable event! But our generous staff and leaders got busy and, using their talents, figured out how to piece together an online worship service with everyone from home – and we didn't miss a Sunday. Their generosity allowed us to prosper!



We've used technology to connect to our children and youth, continued with church meetings and hold small groups. The Zoom technology was made possible with a 50/50 grant from our Conference. That generosity allowed us to refresh and be refreshed by each other. Faithful giving from all of you continued despite not coming together in person. Your generosity and commitment allowed the church to continue to pay our generous staff, buy new microphones, install new AV equipment, and purchase sanitizing equipment and supplies.

We believe that God saw our generosity and commitment and He moved the hearts of the Willmott Foundation to award us a grant of \$25,000 to be used by the Trustees for much needed work on the church facility. Amen!

We are working toward normalcy at church. Little by little we are extending our activities (like Drive Thru Community Dinner), and we are praying that next year will see a return of more and more in-person activities in the building.

On **November 15th**, we will do another normal activity in the life of the church. That day is **Commitment Sunday** for the Annual Budget of the church. You will be able to make your financial commitment to the church either in-person, by email or snail mail. Your commitment will help us to determine what our Ministry will be able to do in 2021. ***Let's be generous so we can prosper in His name, and offer refreshment to others so we can be refreshed in His spirit!***

Ebenezer Hope Ministries Nakivale Update

Here's a quick report about the projects your recent donations to Ebenezer Hope Ministries have supported. The Sunday August 16 donations of Carol DeCann's "Dahlias for Rainwater Collection System" recently collected \$448. That brings the total collected by the end of August to \$1,448. This will be used to build a rainwater collection system, supplied by the Ugandan Water Project Inc., on Redeemed Nakivale Church, the congregation that Pastor Renzha founded. That building's roof can support two systems, costing \$3,600 each.

In the last week of August we sent another wire transfer of \$1,309 to Pastor Jothan to buy food for the refugees. This donation along with the July donation brings the total support for food to \$2,589. Without your help these refugees would still be experiencing starvation due to the pandemic shut-down in Uganda.

The school system closure is part of Uganda's near total shut-down. So there has been no school since January 2020. The second and third term funds are held in banks pending reopening of schools.

Finally, regarding the farm land: Pastor Jothan and the widows not sewing were cultivating the land the last two weeks of August in preparation for the beginning of the rainy season. I learned the first week of September that the farm land was planted with Beans and Maize for the first crop cycle this year.

Thank you all again for your help to these refugees living in the difficult conditions in the camp.

Some helpful tips for writing:

1. Choose a theme or topic. Some examples may be themes of Hope, Joy, Love, Peace represented by the Advent candles; themes/ individuals from the Christmas narrative; the works Christ came to accomplish; personal experiences where God was at work; gifts for Christ (our hearts, souls, minds, and strength); etc.!
2. Advent devotionals have only one truly essential element: Scripture! Most also include written meditations, reflections, or short stories. You can also incorporate a special prayer; favorite songs, hymns, and carols; original illustrations as well as activities and/or games.
3. *Don’t forget to title your Advent devotion!*
