The Aldersgate tradition of providing Christmas dinner and gifts for needy families will continue this year. The need is even greater this year than normal. We want to do what we can to help. Listed below are some of the ways that you can help make this a special Christmas for those families.

What can you do to help?

MONETARY DONATIONS – donations can be placed in the offering plate at church or mailed to Aldersgate, 4115 Dewey Ave., Rochester, NY 14616. Please write White Gifts on the envelope. You can also mail checks to Jan Winter at 176 Kinmont Dr., Rochester, NY 14612. Please make all checks payable to Aldersgate United Methodist Church. ***Charge cards will also be accepted.***

ADOPT-A-FAMILY – You will be assigned a family. Money will be provided from the White Gifts general funds. You have the rewarding assignment of personally shopping and delivering to your “family.”

SPONSOR-A-FAMILY (Full responsibility for a needy family).

Just like the “Adopt-A-Family” option except that you fully sponsor the cost of the food and gifts. Expect to spend between \$300-\$400 for food and gifts for an average size recipient family. *You may want to share this project with other Aldersgate families, co-workers, neighbors, or friends and split the expense.*

Instead of providing groceries this year, we will provide gift cards to Wegman’s, Tops, Walmart, etc. We let the family that we are helping decide. Shopping will only be needed for gifts for the family.

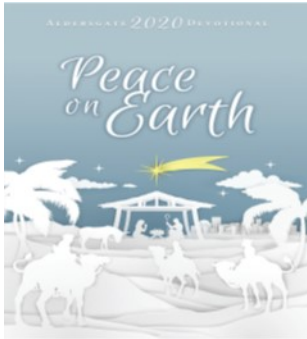

RAIHN Update

Even as most RAIHN host houses of worship are still closed due to COVID-19, homelessness doesn't take a break. Families experiencing homelessness are still being hosted by RAIHN congregations while families are being safely housed in a supporting motel. At the same time, RAIHN has been expanding its services.

We are reaching out to share some important and exciting news with you. Over the course of the next six months, RAIHN (Rochester Area Interfaith Hospitality Network) will be transitioning its name to **Family Promise of Greater Rochester**. Please be assured that while our name will change, our mission remains the same: to provide services to the most vulnerable families in the community, while recognizing the promise each family has to realize their potential.

RAIHN started as a shelter program in 2004 and has since expanded its programming to include a comprehensive aftercare program and eviction prevention

program. As a 16-year affiliate of Family Promise, this is an opportunity to formalize our relationship, which will further enhance our services to truly reflect the five points of the Family Promise star: shelter, aftercare & stabilization, prevention & rehousing, community, and promise (to continue to grow and address the needs of families holistically, while recognizing the promise that each family brings to catalyze their strengths into success).

It is time for us to proudly embrace the name **Family Promise of Greater Rochester** to accurately reflect our new reality. Please continue on this journey with us and know that the power of community can give families a chance to build a better future. Thank you!

Welcome to Winter??!! The Trustees continue to meet monthly to accomplish good projects. Several of our more “handy” Trustees have been in the church taking care of our beautiful building. The Trustees want to THANK EVERYONE who has taken an active role in our Church! It takes a community and all skills & talents are needed; consider bringing yours forth!

With winter upon us, please consider helping to shovel and salt the front and back sidewalks when you can — all means of egress need to be cleared according to the Fire Department. The tools needed will be at each entrance.

Fall Clean Up — October. It's a bit late in coming, but THANK YOU to all who came out to help with Fall Clean up! There was weeding, raking, pulling up of bushes and trimming trees. Of course, Bob Thayer had to do whatever it is that he does up on the roof! At the same time, we had a dumpster delivered and as Matthew Thompson's Eagle Project, all of the miscellaneous items stored under the chapel on the dirt floor were removed and either stored properly or tossed into the dumpster. The dirt floor was also raked and graded. (Thank you to all the family and scouts who helped Matthew!) Very productive day all around! A great turnout of helpers and a great chance to catch up with one another while social distancing outside!

Awarded a grant you say? Aldersgate United Methodist Church has been awarded a grant from the Wilmott Foundation. Thank You to the Stewardship Committee for working through the process! This is great news for our Church! We will be able to do repairs that we have been holding on due to their expense. The grant will come in two portions, one part in 2020 and another in 2021. The money will be used to repair foundation/drainage issues and replace the thermostat in the church to heat more efficiently as well as reduce our RGE bill. The last job known as the “T-Stats” is a project estimated to cost over \$17,000.

Current projects that are being worked on or completed:

- Bud Kress has replaced the spotlights on our sign on Dewey with energy-efficient bulbs
- Mark DeVincentis is lead on a key project. We will be re-keying the entire church. We would like to start with a clean slate so we can monitor and review on a yearly basis who has keys to our facility.



- Colleen Tyler has taken lead in having Mr. Rooter complete work related to the foundation and the water that comes in. You may notice some digging in the lawn along the classroom sides of the building. Once Mr. Rooter went into the drainage, it was worse than anticipated and the cost has almost doubled.
- The parsonage has had extermination for bees and mice. We will now have bi-monthly pest control inspections happening.
- The elevator needed repair that was not covered by our preventive maintenance contract so we had an unexpected bill of over \$2,000 in November. Things come up and your tithes and offerings to the church help cover these unexpected expenses. Thank you.
- Dave Roza found a company to repair the dishwasher in the Ide Center. HUGE savings!!!
- Mark D has done some miscellaneous repairs to the rental property.

Church Security — We continue to need volunteers to assist with the evening walk throughs. Might this be an opportunity for you to provide service to the Church community? Thank you to our faithful and trusty current checkers — we all appreciate YOU! Reach out to Colleen Tyler if interested or have questions.
