


Ash Wednesday Service — Both In Person and Live Streamed

Luckily the new owner saved my cards and was able to give them to me.





First Sunday of Lent


"Take Time to Grow and Thrive": Pretzel Sunday

What is Shrove Tuesday?

Shrove Tuesday is an important day in the Christian religion, which takes place the day before Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. The name of the day derives from the English word 'shrive,' which means to repent for your sins through confession. This idea is crucial to Shrove Tuesday as Lent is a time for Christians to reflect on their life and confess to any sins. But, you might be wondering, what does that have to do with pancakes? Traditionally, Shrove Tuesday was the last opportunity to use up eggs and fats before embarking on the fast for Lent. Making pancakes is a simple and tasty way to use up all of these ingredients!

Ebenezer Hope Ministries

As this year of pandemic lock down closes, I have received the following update from Pastors Renzha and Jothan:

The first crop has been harvested and the second crop has been planted in the Nakivale farm land Aldersgate recently bought. Beans and corn were planted. The rains were very heavy this second cycle. As a result the beans did not do very well, however the corn crop is excellent! Again the refugees have expressed their Very Strong Gratitude and Joy for being given the opportunity to grow their own food. In an otherwise dire situation about obtaining food they have sufficient food to meet their needs.

With the pandemic the lock down in Uganda, and especially for the refugee camp, is supposed to be total. So refugees are not able to leave camp to work and/or barter for food. Refugees are given only 30 Shillings per person to obtain their food for a whole year. The pastors reported to me that because of these desperate conditions two Burundi refugees left camp to go to Tanzania. When they returned they were infected with Covid-19, and so the authorities took them away to Kampala – a seven hour drive – and they have not been returned to the camp. That is why the refugees supported by Ebenezer Hope Ministries and growing their own food are so thankful to all of you for all the support you have enabled for them. The food sufficient for them to survive is a great gift from Aldersgate.

As reported earlier, school has been suspended since the completion of the first term 2020. There is currently consideration about whether to start school again at the end of January 2021. If this is approved, then this will be considered as the beginning of a new school year. The funds donated last year and held on account will be used to support the first and second terms for 2021. Thus donations in 2021 for student scholarships for the students you support would only be needed to fund the third term in that year. I will keep you updated as decisions are made regarding schooling in Nakivale Refugee Settlement.

Have a safe and healthy New Year, and Blessings to you all for your support of Ebenezer Hope Ministries.

From Now Until Forever!


"I have won. I have lost. I've got it right sometimes and sometimes I did not." ("Through all of it" written by Ben Glover, sung by Colton Dixon)

New Key Requests

In the first week of February, the Church Trustees are having the locks in the church re-keyed and everyone will need to apply for a new key. All key requests will need to be approved by the church trustees before they are issued. Priority consideration will be given to church employees, committee leaders and those designated by committee leaders. The safety of our church is of primary concern and we need to ensure only those who require a key have it. When job or volunteer responsibilities change, keys will need to be turned in and, if appropriate, new ones will be issued. We are asking that all old keys are turned in once the rekeying is complete. If keys are lost, there will be a charge of \$3 to replace.

Once the rekeying is complete, if you have completed the key request, you will be informed when your key is awaiting you.

Trustees' Corner

Drainage Dig

You may have noticed the soil has been disturbed to the right of the main entrance. At the end of January, Mr. Rooter returned to dig and replace about 10 feet of drainage pipe. We hope that this will help with the water issues that have affected the old offices by Fellowship Hall. There is still pipe that needs to be replaced along the same wall closer to the old entrance. This will be added to our future task list.

In addition to the water issue in the ground there is also leakage coming from the roof and the effects can be seen in the back of the chapel. When it rains heavily, the water seeps through the ceiling. The cause is believed to be from around the chimney and we have brought in an expert to give an evaluation.

Thermostat Update

The thermostats in the older section of the church will be replaced in February. This has been a much-needed task to help with regulating the heat issue in the education wing. The cost of this project is \$17,200 and will be covered by the Wilmott grant our church was awarded. The Trustees have also investigated replacing the thermostats in the newer section of the church and connecting them to the thermostats that are being replaced. The cost of this is around \$16,000 and will be added to our wish list.

Stewardship Corner

New Mortgage Payment Amount

As part of our mortgage agreement with Canandaigua National Bank, our interest rate is adjusted every 5 years. This year, we were excited to learn that our monthly payment has been reduced from \$11,331 to \$9,398! We plan to try to continue to make our old payment amount so that our mortgage will be paid off early.

With the support of all of you, we can make this happen!

God has blessed us so much. We have been able to make a dream – the church expansion – a reality. What a step of faith our initial undertaking of this project was! We couldn't even get a bank to loan us the money. Initially, we sold bonds to cover the expense. Our first monthly

payment was \$17,493! But, we made it until we were able to refinance with the bank and save a substantial amount of money.

Thanks to all of you who are helping us work toward the end of the mortgage!


