Now it's time to grow us to become resurrection lilies. How? Remove all the dead parts, start feeding and watering the roots, and paying a little attention to it every day.


Would you please join me in singing another great Easter hymn?

Ebenezer Hope Ministries

Aldersgate continues to support projects that supply safe drinking water to refugees in the Nakivale Refugee Settlement via our Ebenezer Hope Ministries. Aldersgate's support of this life-giving program continues in partnership with the Ugandan Water Project, Inc. (UWP).


UWP is an international organization, headquartered in Lima, New York, that facilitates many projects to supply safe drinking water throughout Uganda. Through Aldersgate and Ebenezer Hope Ministries, UWP has been able to work in Nakivale specifically supporting the refugee population that we were introduced to via Pastor Renzha, pastor of Aldersgate's African Community. The information below from UWP's 2020 annual report shows the accomplishments of UWP's 2020 work.

Aldersgate supported installation of 28 Sawyer water filtration systems that were installed in January 2019. Fifteen systems were installed in various churches in Nakivale, 4 systems were installed in the Ebenezer Hope Ministries compound (which includes the

sewing and office buildings), and 9 systems were installed in the medical compound for use during the dry season. We are now working to collect the bountiful amount of rain water available during the rainy season. Redeemed Nakivale Church, the congregation founded by Pastor Renzha, has a roof large enough to hold two rain water collection systems. Each system costs \$3,600 fully installed. So far \$2,523 has been donated to this project.

If you are interested in contributing to this project please send your donation to Aldersgate so that it is recorded for your giving, and indicate that the donation is for the African Rainwater Project.

Living Out Micah's Message

As Christians we are told to "live out" the Gospels, but there are passages in nearly every book of Scripture that we should strive to live out. As you'll be reading this, Lent is just about over and Easter upon us, but as I'm writing it, there are several weeks left. If there is a prevailing scripture in the Lenten Devotional we've been following, it would be Micah 6:8: "...Seek Justice...Love Mercy... Walk Humbly with God." It is said, when something in Scripture is repeated, pay attention to it! Well, when something *from* scripture is repeated, I would say pay attention to it as well. So, let's pick it apart!

One: Seek Justice: Martin Luther King said that: 'No one is free until we are all free!' (or something like that.) There are many oppressed people in our nation and right in our own community. Living out Micah's Message means **admitting** that there are people who still want what we take for granted, and "fighting," with our prayers for, presence with and service to them until they get it!

Two: Love Mercy! Let's face it, being hurt, well, HURTS! Forgiveness is HARD! Seeking forgiveness, even harder! I've never regretted forgiving anyone though, and I hope no one has ever regretted forgiving me!

Three: Walk Humbly! Now, both of the first two would take humility. So, I think this is a different kind of humility. Those were about how we treat people; this, I think, is about how we treat God. In Scripture God compares Himself to a parent or even a spouse, with one exception. Yes, He wants us to question, even argue with Him, if it gets our true feelings out, as long as we remember that He is God, He rules over all, and He's pretty much always right!

I once wrote a Lenten "list:" "Give up for Lent and/or Add on for Life!" Now, I don't remember how many I actually kept but my intentions were good. While Lent may be over, Easter is upon us. I hope that living out Micah 6:8 is something that we add on for Life!
