Easter People

Easter people, raise your voices, sounds of heaven in earth should ring. "Alleluia! Alleluia!" Easter people, let us sing.

I love this hymn (United Methodist Hymnal #304).

We celebrated Easter in April.

We are Easter people. To Easter people, Easter is not just one day celebration. To Easter people, every day is Easter as verse 3 sings.

Christ is risen! He is alive in your heart and in my heart today, tomorrow and everyday.

So verse 2 sings:

Fear of death can no more stop us from our pressing here below. For our Risen Lord empowers us to triumph over every foe. Alleluia! Alleluia! On to victory now we go.

When the cares of life o'erwhelm us, Easter people, sing this song: *"Alleluia! Alleluia!" Everlasting triumph song* (verse 3).

You know the story of two of Jesus' disciples who, on their way to Emmaus, met the risen Christ. Seeing the risen Christ, their faith was empowered to overcome even the power of death.

The Risen Jesus stayed with the disciples for 40 days. Before He ascended to heaven, He said He would send the Holy Spirit. As He promised the Holy Spirit came down to them. Suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. The power of God touched each person — the power of God who raised Jesus from the dead.

Easter people are Pentecost people. Anyone who has faith in the Risen Jesus is given the power of the resurrection in him/her.

Easter people sing "Alleluia! Alleluia!" because our Risen Lord empowers us to triumph over every foe.



Father's Day, Graduation and an announcement about our Summer's Spectacular Event!

The Reopening Task Force continues to meet monthly to review how things are going in the church as well as plan for how we can follow our mission to 'Grow and Thrive'. Kudos to all our members for staying faithful while we have been paused, as well as being willing to adapt to all the directives for keeping us all safe from the virus. As far as we are aware, no one has contracted COVID from exposure at our church. What a blessing!

With the rate of positivity declining, and more and more people getting vaccinated, we are starting to plan ahead for the return of other activities within our church aside from worship and Sunday school.

We are actively working with the New Door AA group that had been meeting every morning in our church to return to their meetings Monday – Saturday, hopefully staring April 19th. The pandemic has hit these groups especially hard and they are anxious to return. This will be a pilot program (the other AA/AI Anon/Gambling Anon groups will not be part of this pilot) so we can evaluate how well it can work. They will be using a hybrid method (just like we do for church) with only about half of their members attending in person and the other half joining online.

Another community outreach program that we will start back will be Drive-Thru Community Dinner in May – date TBD.

Reopening Task Force Update

Within the church, we are still recommending that church meetings continue to use Zoom, but we are reaching out to all Small Groups and inviting them to request a return to having meetings at church. There is a Facilities Use form that will be available either via email or in the church office with the guidelines for using the facility that will need to be signed and returned to someone on the Task Force. This is mainly so that we know who will be using the building, and communicate to our custodial staff the need for cleaning that area.

We are also talking with Candy from the UMW on their plans for the Rummage Sale this year. We have given an initial green light for this event and the group is now tasked with the best way to set up and run the event. Rhonda and Brian have also been given the green light for hosting a church-family-only VBS-like event this summer. More information on all of these events to come.

If there are other activities or events that you would like to hold please reach out to someone on the Task Force and we will be happy to talk to you about it. Our next meeting is May 5th.
