From the Pastor

Active Life in The New Normal



2021 has been a year of continued challenges. In a world seemingly dominated by a global pandemic that just won't go away, extreme heat and wild

fires, hurricanes and floods, turmoil and unrest in the Middle East, suffering in India and Africa . . . all we hear is bad news.

But church is where to go to hear the Good News, and weekly Worship continues to be the heart of our church. Uplifting music, scripture, meaningful messages, communion and prayer all serve to fill us each week with God's blessings.

Much has happened this year to move us forward. Greg Meisenzahl has joined us as our new Contemporary Worship Team Leader. The team worked on building their repertoire in order to be ready by Sept. 12th for our first full Contemporary service since March of 2020. The Chancel Choir under the leadership of Matt Pedelty with Kaori Winter dusted off their vocal cords so we could return to a full Traditional service.

Where else do we see the heart of our church?

Our children and youth through our Christian Education programs lead by Rhonda Simonelli and Brian Winter, learn about God and biblical principles during Sunday school, VBS and other fun and engaging programs. Our youth are encouraged to participate in service to the church through their gifts of music, technology, as acolytes, as well as other church events.

Our Trustees accomplished some major work at church via the Wilmott grant received last year to repair drainage around the church and update the thermostats in the old section of the building. The Community Dinner led by Mary Sims continues, while still as a drive-thru event, to serve about 200 meals a month. The church has reopened to the AA groups and they are so grateful to be

able to have in-person meetings again. Small groups are returning to in-person meetings where people are making connections and doing deeper studies of the Bible. Pastor Doug Hess is restarting our Grief Share program. And we continue to work with our African community to support education opportunities for the children of the Nakivale Refugee camp.

The vision for 2022 is no less ambitious. We want the heart of Aldersgate to GROW! *None of the ministries of the church are viable without your financial support.*

We want to provide meaningful, life-changing worship every week, increasing the number of people attending in person as well as increasing those who attend our services online via Facebook or YouTube. (Thanks to the AV and Live Stream teams for making this happen!) We want to continue nurturing persons in their faith journey through Christian Education, Small Groups, Adult Bible study and Youth groups. We want to continue to witness our faith in service beyond ourselves by returning to inperson Community Dinner, partnering with our African community, and to be able to provide full support of our UM Ministry share.

November 14th will be this year's Commitment Sunday where every member will have the opportunity to offer a financial pledge to support the annual budget of the church. **Your financial gifts are the life blood of the church enabling our ministries to flourish.** You will be able to make your commitment in person, by email or by postal mail.

Your heartfelt commitment will help us to determine what the ministries of Aldersgate church will be able to do in 2022.

Ebenezer Hope Ministries

Permanent Solution to Yearly Tuition for Nakivale Settlement Students

Following is a proposal presented as an update to change the current method of scholarship support of Nakivale Students via Ebenezer Hope Ministries (EHM) to a method that will end the necessity of yearly donations to each student's scholarship, as well as support EHM students who are currently not receiving an education due to lack of funding.

Summarizing our current EHM scholarship program: EHM is currently supporting just over 70 students with a total donation of scholarship and banking fees of over \$12,000/year. The number of children associated with EHM that is NOT supported is considerably more than the number supported, and is slowly growing. Besides the generous support from members of Aldersgate UMC there are only a few other congregations and non-AUMC members who have responded to the Spirit's call to support this program. At this point it seems unlikely that many new supporters for the scholarship program will come forward, so considerations for other ways to support EHM schools were considered.

Proposal: Build a school to support 7 Primary Grades, with 7 class rooms and an office.

- Ebenezer students will go to this school tuition free;
- 2) Other students in Nakivale will pay tuition, which will support the operation costs.

This program model will allow ALL students associated with EHM to attend school. Currently we only support 71 students with now well over that many waiting for an education.

Starting next year EHM donations will be used to pay for building a private school. Pastors Renzha and Jothan have been working with the Nakivale Camp Commandant who has been working hard to improve conditions in Nakivale, since it has grown into a functioning city with a basic economy. For example there are now rules like all refugee buildings must have iron roofs. Electricity trunk lines, although not 24/7 reliable, are being delivered to the entire camp over a time period. The Commandant has told Pastor Renzha that he will grant land for the building of the school if it is funded.



Teachers will be paid from item #2 above. The quality of the education will be good; quality teachers have been identified and are ready to teach.

Pastor James – Pastor of the Ugandan Church in Nakivale – has a son who will help with the certification and operation of the school. Since he is a Ugandan citizen he can operate in this position and officially facilitate this program.

We would like to run this funding program for the 2-year period of 2022 – 2023. To initiate this program, we would like to run a 2-year fundraising to cover the cost of the building, which would be a total cost of \$12,000. As noted above we are currently donating over \$12,000 each year to fund the scholarships. So if the sponsors would donate half of what they donate now for each of two years we should easily be able to fund this project. Then there will be no more yearly tuition funding program.
