






Faery Tree People

I'm a proud Irishman, but I admit my people are a superstitious lot. I heard a story on a visit to the land of my ancestors, two years ago, about the Faery tree. There is a strong belief among some people that it is very bad luck to remove, or even move, a Faery tree. They grow wild and dot the landscape especially in the Western part of Ireland. I was struck by the story of one person who stood before a Town Council and told the people that they couldn't build a road where they wanted to, simply because of a Faery tree. I'm sure they were laughed at, ridiculed, perhaps even persecuted by those who were being held up by this protest to their project. But you know what? The Council relented, spending more money on a different track for the new road.

Now; that's just a silly story of people believing a crazy, ancient, idea and the lengths they went to in order to defend it. Irish folklore is full of such stories. But do you know what else is full of such stories? The Bible, and the history of the United Methodists and other churches. They believed stories and followed practices many thought were crazy. And many still do today.

So, how about you? Are you bold enough (some will say crazy enough) to be the only one in your group who stops to pray, attends church and Bible Study? Or, perhaps harder, the only one NOT drinking to excess, gambling, or using foul or demeaning language? Are you bold enough to stand before a crowd and say they should or shouldn't allow something to happen?!

We definitely know Jesus would and did! We're about to "celebrate" the week that honors how far Jesus would go to defend His beliefs. Yes, He was persecuted for it, but God was there for Him and brought Him Victoriously through it!

Ask God for the strength, and the resolve, to be True followers of Jesus. Commit to being Holy Thursday and Good Friday, as well as Easter people. Commit to being Faery Tree People!

Stewardship Update

Beyond our Wildest Dreams...

In Ephesians 3:20 (MESSAGE), the Bible says "God can do anything, you know – for more than you could ever imagine or guess or request in your wildest dreams. He does it not by pushing us around, but by working within us, his Spirit deeply and gently within us."

That certainly says it all when it comes to the building project our church undertook back in 2005 to build the large Sanctuary, Gathering space, Ide Center and kitchen, office space and handicap accessible entrance and bathrooms.

The church raised \$1,000,000 for the down payment and then financed \$2,100,000 by selling bonds. 16 years later, with 2 refinances and substantial donations from the estate of John Haldane, and a donation from the Jack and Dorothy Pearson Charitable Foundation, on June 1, 2022 the principal balance will be \$519,117.33 with a payoff date no later than 9/1/2026.

Wow!!! We are almost there! The end is in sight. We are hoping for this to be our last debt reduction campaign. Coming in May we will be sharing lots of information about this final campaign, show a video made for the very 1st campaign in 2005 and detail how you can help get the church free from our debt.


