Greetings to an Exultation of Aldersgaters!

Stewardship Update

Spiritual Stewardship is a *special responsibility given to us by God* to cultivate resources, and guard and use those resources wisely to benefit the church, each other and the world around us. Whew, that's a mouthful! Put another way, each of us as stewards of the church are asked to give generously of our time, talents and treasure and to use them as effectively as possible to benefit the church, each other, the community and the world.

The past two years have been a challenge due to Covid, but this year we are seeing a resurgence in the life of the church; restrictions have been eliminated and we are rapidly returning to normalcy within our walls.

Three worship services have been held each week since August of 2021, and this year we eliminated all restrictions; masks can be worn but aren't required, drinks and treats are now being served after each service to encourage fellowship (sign up to bring in your favorite baked goods on the Opportunity board!), singing is full-voiced, we are passing the plate again, and asking all to fill out a Connection Card – great way to see and sign up for activities and service opportunities at the church. There are all sorts of servants who make worship possible; those who greet and seat all who walk through the door, scripture readers, musicians, Live Stream and AV support, Christian Ed leaders (both children and adult), altar committee, acolytes, prayer leaders, communion preparation, those who set up and take down refreshments between services, and those who count and handle the offering each week, and of course our Pastors. So many who use their time and talents each week to ensure we have inspirational and spirit filling worship each week.

Our children continue to receive quality Christian education each week and our youth are visible as they share their musical talent with us, acolyte, help out during between-service fellowship time, as well as help at events like the Easter egg hunt and Pentecost picnic. There was a snow tubing event this winter, and a day at Darien Lake/ Kingdom Bound is being planned in July. For those in K-5, Vacation Bible Camp is coming August 1 - 4.



Pastor Doug has used his considerable talents to lead several caring ministries at church. Visitation ministry reaches out to over 15 people who are no longer able to attend church in person, the Eucharist ministry started in April serves Communion to 8-10 people each month, and the Card Ministry sends cards to members for special life events, as well as for healing, sympathy or just to say "We're thinking of You!" Pastor Doug also leads

Grief Share and Adult Sunday school, as well as special Small Group studies. Several Small group teams continue to meet . . . in church, at homes, or over Zoom.

Our Trustees have been busy sprucing up our church building. With a healthy Capital Improvement Fund from generous and steady donations, many projects have been accomplished – with more planned. The roof leak in the Chapel has been repaired...not just patched. A new stove has been installed in the Ide Center kitchen with a new dishwasher being purchased and a replacement for the non-functioning garbage disposal being planned. New, lighter tables have been purchased which will make set up and tear downs for events much easier. A new entry door to the Chapel from the parking lot is being planned for this summer. There have also been small projects done as well; gutters fixed, new lights installed, carpet updates planned. This list goes on and all are important to keep our building attractive, safe and functioning well for all.

The United Women of Faith

sponsored a Tai Chi class in May and have plans to bring a full 8-week session back in September. Craig Shirley is coming to do a share with us about his latest book in August, and the Annual Rummage Sale is coming back the first week in October.

We have also **opened our doors to the Community**. High school groups are practicing basketball, folks are playing pickle ball, AA/GA group are meeting 7-days a week; a Crafting Workshop was held with more to come, the African community hosted a Youth Conference one weekend in April, and we are returning to indoors Community Dinner in June.

We continue in our ministry to the world with our support of the **Nakivale school building project in Uganda**. Over half of the money needed has been raised and building has started on time!

The people of Aldersgate have always taken their stewardship responsibilities seriously and with God's help and blessings we will continue to do so well into the future.

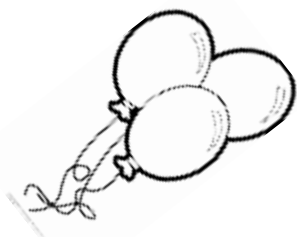

The details:

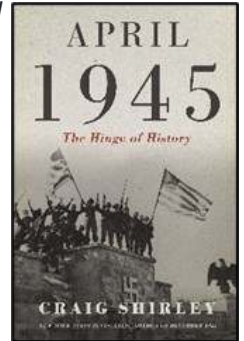
