Good News: As of September, the principal we owe is now under the half million mark — \$497,807 to be exact. We are on the home stretch for getting this paid off!





School Update

We have been working with the Director of the Ministry of Education of the Ugandan Federal Government to finalize approval for the school plans. The Director has made a number of suggestions and requests that we all agree results in "win-win" improvements in the plan and program. As a result the Director has issued this school a Registration Number from the Ugandan Government. This means the school is now officially fully sanctioned by the Federal Government of Uganda.

To answer the Director's first questions related to Ebenezer Hope Ministries' reliability and trustworthiness, Pastor Renzha and I wrote a letter to the Director describing all of the progress made via your donations these past number of years. After his investigations confirming these accomplishments, the Director was positively impressed and moved to facilitate the development of this school.

While we originally planned to build a Primary School (Grade School) the Director noted that he felt there are already sufficient Primary Schools available in the region; however there is a shortage of Secondary Schools (High School Grades). So if we would agree to build a Secondary School he would support that and also donate a very desirable and larger building site, which will facilitate Ugandan Citizen Student access to the school as well as Nakivale Refugee Students. Better Ugandan Citizen access is important because they can afford and will pay a tuition that will guarantee the cash flow plan for continued operation of this school serving the Nakivale Students. Building use allotments will be changed slightly to support the Secondary School.

The new land plot is located near the junction between the main road and the road that leads into the Nakivale Refugee Settlement. This is where the government has a security guard station to control traffic into the refugee camp. This will result in security personnel being near the

school. The smaller land plot originally purchased in the camp will be sold to regain that cash.

This plan also addresses a concern we had with the original Primary School plan: Where will the Nakivale students be able to find the higher level education of a Secondary School?
