





Ash Wednesday, February 22

Ash Wednesday is a day set aside every year for us to reflect on our need for penance and reconciliation with God. When Isaiah foretold the coming of Christ, he wrote, "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him, and by his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way, and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all." (Isaiah 53:5, 6)

By "our transgressions," it means we have stepped over the boundaries God has set in the commandments He delivered through Moses, our Lord Jesus, and the servants, his Apostles and prophets. By "our iniquities," he refers to the immoral, unjust, and unfair behavior we display towards God and man. These together fall under the broader category of "sin." Sin itself is a missing of the mark—like an archer firing an arrow that fails to miss its target. And that target is holiness.

God says, "be holy, for I am holy." It means that God has set us aside for a purpose. He has redeemed (purchased) us to make a difference in the lives of people around us and bring Him glory. At the same time, God is aware of our shortcomings and imperfections. We can only be holy through the leading of the Spirit. But when we "miss the mark," God still loves us and has a plan. Because of His great love for us, He sent His Son to take upon himself the punishment for our sins, that we might be forgiven. The Apostle John assures us that, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:9).

On Ash Wednesday, we reflect and confess the wrongs we have done—whether intentionally or unintentionally—and we repent. Repentance is a change of mind that results in a change of action. The ashes placed upon our forehead is a reminder of our mortality, and the shape of the cross is a reminder of Him who brings us immortality.

May we never forget the great lengths Jesus went through to wash away all our sin! Amen.

Being Good Witnesses

"And you will be My Witnesses, in Judea, Samaria and all the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Being a good witness, whether to the police or in court or to a non-believer about Christ, can be scary; but you can be more effective at both by keeping your "testimony" brief and simple. Tell a little of 'where you were' before your encounter with the one you're testifying about, what they did to/for you and how it affected you.

Five years ago, Pastor Anne O'Connor gave us the assignment of sharing our testimony in 100 words or less. I have rewritten mine, to be ready for, hopefully, many opportunities in this year ahead to be a witness for Christ. I share it with you now to encourage you to prepare your own 'witness statement' and be ready for your own opportunities.

"I was raised going to church, knowing 'about' God, but not knowing God. I was labeled 'different,' so, while I believed God did those things in the Bible, I didn't feel worthy of Him doing them for me. That all changed about 21 years ago. It was gradual and I don't have an exact date, like some do. That's Ok, though. I know the change He made in me. I have a confidence now because, no matter what people think, He LOVES me! And, no matter what happens I know things will work out, because; 'If it's not good, God's not done!'"

That's my testimony. I encourage you to write out yours and, as the new year progresses, be prepared to share your own Good News with the hurting world around us.
