








### Easter Baskets

It is my joy to share with you today that Bishop Hector A. Burgos-Nunez has appointed The Reverend Yohang Chun as the new pastor of our congregation. Rev. Chun will begin his new responsibilities to Aldersgate on July 1 of this year. Pastor Chun is currently appointed at Oswego United Methodist Church.

As a United Methodist congregation, we are part of an itinerant appointment system. Our congregation's Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) has met with the district superintendent (Pastor Ted Anderson) to identify our congregation's needs and the skills needed in a pastor for our context. We also met with Rev. Chun to get to know him and ask questions.

Pastor Yohang Chun has experienced two different church cultures — the American United Methodist Church and the Korean Methodist Church. Building upon his unique experiences, he has sought to fuse his ministry with the strengths, heritages, and well-developed traditions of both churches—pursuing the Third Way of ministry.

Joyce, Pastor Yohang’s wife, also has a strong passion for ministry. Together, they have been married for 22 years and celebrate their special gifts from God — Melissa and Joshua, who are both students at Princeton. In his free time, Pastor Yohang enjoys reading, watching movies with his family, and playing tennis and golf.

We also want to thank our current pastor, Rev. Sung Ho Lee for his time of service with us and wish him and Jung well as he retires and begins a new chapter in his life’s journey.

Pastor Yohang will work with us and the conference so that we continue to nurture disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Bishop Burgos-Nunez, our district superintendent, Ted Anderson and the Upper New York Conference leaders will work with Pastor Yohang and Aldersgate to continue growing as a congregation. I ask that you join our bishop, our new pastor, and me in helping to make new disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

## **HEEL! STAY CLOSE, but MOVE!!**

*“Under His wings you will find refuge.” (Ps. 91:4) “Now GO and take possession.” (Deut.1:8)*

Since I last wrote, my life has drastically, Joyously but still drastically, changed! We brought home a 4-month-old Australian Shepherd puppy! I’m teaching her commands, or trying to, especially to make the long walks I take her on be safer and more “peaceful.”

One of the most common, and important, commands to teach for walking is “Heel!” This essentially means: ‘Get as close to my side as possible, stop briefly, and then MOVE!’ This is used when the dog’s human companion sees a potentially difficult situation ahead, such as traffic or another dog. It’s important for the dog’s human to know exactly where they are and have total control.

The only problem with “Heel” is the “Stop” part. Dogs aim to please and you told him/her to stop, but you need to move the dog through the situation, once it’s safe again, quickly. The light, now changed in your favor, or the, hopefully responsible, other dog owner, holding their dog in “Heel,” will only be that way for a moment. You and your dog need to move quickly. That’s where the second part comes in, “Stay Close to me, but MOVE!” You are

keeping a tight grip on the leash, but the time for assessing is over. For you and your dog to safely reach your destination, you need to MOVE!

As you know, I love words and what God does with my words! The first time I used those phrases with my puppy, I heard God saying: “Some of my people need to hear that same thing!”

So, perhaps there’s a “potentially difficult” situation ahead of you. (That could define life on any given day.) Or perhaps your life has changed drastically too, recently, but not in a Joyous way; through the loss of a loved one, or a job, or a devastating illness or diagnosis. By all means, first, “Heel!” Get as close as you can to your Divine Master, through Scripture, fellowship and prayer, and stop briefly to assess the situation. But then MOVE! Stay close to God, follow His lead, take that next, albeit terrifying, step! I Promise you, He’s got a firm hold on you and will NEVER let go!
