### From the Pastor

February 14th is Ash Wednesday, marking the first day of a 40-day Lenten journey. February 18th will mark the first Sunday of Lent. The Lenten season is upon us. Compared to previous years, this year's Lenten season arrives a little earlier. In fact, as Christians, we can't imagine our spiritual journey without the Christian calendar, which includes the Lenten season, Pentecost, Advent season, and so on. This brings us to the question, "Why do we need to observe the Christian calendar annually?"

There are several reasons for this, such as remembrance and celebration of our faith journey, unity in the faith community, teaching and passing on the faith, among others. This shows that the Christian calendar is not just a way to mark time but is a spiritual tool that enriches faith, fosters community, encourages spiritual discipline, and connects believers to the historical and universal church.

So, as the Lenten season approaches, why don't we reflect anew on the meaning of this 40-day spiritual journey?

Traditionally, the church has used these forty days for introspection, reflecting on the last days of Jesus' life. Personally, I encourage you to take a time of silence during this Lenten season to deepen your intimacy with the Lord, our Lord and Savior. This practice was also observed by our spiritual ancestors during this special season.

## Join the Bell Choir to Make Special Music on Easter Sunday on March 31




### Reading Circle on February 8 at 1:30 PM in the Library

We will be discussing the best-selling historical fiction novel from Kim Michele Richardson — *The Book Women of Troublesome Creek*. This is a novel following Cussy Mary, a packhorse librarian, and her quest to bring books to the Appalachian community she loves.

The hardscrabble folks of Troublesome Creek have to scrap for everything—everything except books, that is. Thanks to Roosevelt's Kentucky Pack Horse Library Project, Troublesome's got its very own traveling librarian, Cussy Mary Carter.

Cussy is not only a book woman, however, she's also the last of her kind — her skin a shade of blue unlike most anyone else. Not everyone is keen on Cussy's family or the Library Project, and a Blue is often blamed for any whiff of trouble. If Cussy wants to bring the joy of books to the hill folks, she's going to have to confront prejudice as old as the Appalachias and suspicion as deep as the holler.

Inspired by the true blue-skinned people of Kentucky and the brave and dedicated Kentucky Pack Horse library service of the 1930s, The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek is a story of raw courage, fierce strength, and one woman's belief that books can carry us anywhere—even back home.

### **Lenten Pretzel Sunday is February 18<sup>th</sup>**

During both Sunday School class times, we will meet in the kitchen to make and bake pretzels. We will serve them to the congregation after each worship service. Below is some information about this tradition and the recipe we will use that day.



Pretzels are the shape people traditionally made with their arms when they prayed



- 1 Tablespoon honey or sugar 350ml lukewarm water
- 1 envelope active dry yeast 1 teaspoon salt
- 480g flour
- Coarse salt 1 egg beaten

Add the honey to the water; sprinkle in the yeast and stir until dissolved. Add 1 tsp salt. Blend into the flour, and knead the dough till smooth.


Cut the dough into pieces.

Roll them into ropes and twist into pretzels shapes. Place the pretzels on lightly greased cookie sheets and brush them with the beaten egg and sprinkle with salt. Pretzels were originally eaten only at Lent as they didn't use any of the ingredients that you weren't allowed to eat at that time.

Bake at 220 degrees C (Gas Mark 7) for 12 to 15 minutes or until golden brown.

### Nana's Chair

"Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need." (Hebrews 4:16)

As I'm writing this it's been almost exactly one year that we've been in our "new" house. I had two main stipulations when looking for a house, and then when deciding what to bring and what to buy new: there had to be a room for my grandson, Damian, to stay overnights in the new house and my favorite, still fairly new, chair had to come. As we have things arranged, as Damian comes out of his room my chair, usually with me in it, is the first thing he sees.

I have found out the hard way, over the last year that Damian has strange sleep patterns. While he will sleep a full 8 hours or more, he doesn't always fall asleep at a "decent" hour for a 3-year-old. After a handful of times of my pointing to the bed and after he scrambles back into it, turning out the light, there will often be a point where he comes all the way out of his room and stands by my chair looking at me with sad eyes that seem to say: "I can't find Peace by myself. I need to be held." Then I'll take him in my lap in my chair, cuddle him, kiss him, sing hymns and lullabies to him and he'll drift off to sleep.

I'm sure that we've all, as we've drawn closer or sought to draw closer to God, come up with an image of what drawing closer would "be" like or "look" like. By coincidence (or "God-incidence"), my image, since long before becoming a grandparent, has been of an older "grandfatherly" figure inviting me up (sometimes picking me up) into His lap!

Whatever our image is, I think (I hope) we all know that God is there waiting for us to come to Him. But we follow different paths to try to find happiness and Peace (like a 3-year-old up playing with toys at midnight!). And yet He is still there, always there when we come back with sad eyes, saying we can't find Peace anywhere else. He is always there to bring us Peace and show us the way to true happiness.

And part of my original bedtime routine (at that decent hour) involves praying with Damian, teaching Him to pray. And a large part of having him on the weekends is to take him to church where he can begin his own relationship with God. There will come a day in Damian's life (I pray so anyway) when I have gone to Heaven and my chair has fallen apart but God will always be there waiting to hold him, and all of us, in His "lap" and comfort and protect us.


### **Ebenezer Hope Ministries Nakivale School Building Project Re-started**

As recently presented during Sunday announcement time, we have solved the previous roadblock interfering with the building of the school in Nakivale. We will be adding a church to the school building area so that the program falls under the oversight of the Ugandan Federal Church.

The funding kick-off is officially January 2024, and in fact we have

already received over \$800 in donations in December of 2023 from members of Aldersgate UMC and one other local UMC congregation.

Now we are requesting everyone who has supported student scholarships in the past to please donate at least that equivalent annual amount, which should support the necessary building program. Once built the school is



expected to be self-supporting from tuitions from local residents. Pastor Renzha reports that he has seen the land EHM owns for the future school, and it is in a very desirable location.
