

From the Pastor

As I await Easter, I've been reminded once again of the importance of waiting in our lives. During the cold winter months, I often find myself wondering, "Will spring truly come to Greece?" Despite living in the upper New York area for over 20 years, this question arises in my mind every year. Now, spring has indeed arrived.

In reality, there's nothing I can do to hasten this change. I cannot make spring come sooner than it does. All I can do is wait patiently within God's creation. Waiting, especially without losing hope, is one of the most challenging aspects of our lives. Nowadays, we are an impatient society, craving quick services and valuing speed. We live in a time that is obsessed with immediate results. The delay of a text message or an email can seem intolerable. In our current culture, being slow is almost seen as a sin.

This contemplation led me to a question: If we were among the Christians who witnessed Jesus' crucifixion and laid Him in a tomb, how would we have waited for His resurrection? Perhaps we would not have waited three days, thinking it too long to wait. Likely, we would have expected His resurrection immediately after placing His body in the tomb. However, Jesus did not resurrect immediately; He rose after three days.

Why? I cautiously believe that Jesus wanted us to wait for His resurrection with patience and hope. He wanted us to understand the importance of waiting in our spiritual journeys. Therefore, I personally think that one of the messages of the Resurrection is the act of waiting. Waiting is a necessary step in the journey from death to resurrection.

If someone were to ask me what I would pack in my spiritual journey's backpack, I would say patience, the ability to wait. I believe that this virtue, "waiting patiently," will lead us to our destination, particularly as we reflect on the Resurrection of Jesus in Easter season.



Devotional:

As If Your Life Depends On It!

"...Do not turn from it to the right or to the left..."
(Josh. 1:7)

One of my favorite, older, NCIS episodes revolves around the work of a mine sniffing dog. In the opening scene the dog and his handler rescue a child after a ball the child rolled set off a buried land mine no more than 10 feet from where the child was standing. (The setting was Afghanistan in the middle of the war.) The dog, nose to the ground, set a course directly out to the child. The handler, however, didn't walk alongside, like you or I would walk our dogs. The handler, slowly and deliberately, walked straight behind — directly in the footprints (paw prints) of his dog. Then, with one hand on the dog's harness, again walking directly in his paw prints, he had his other hand on the child, making sure the child walked directly in his footprints — literally as if their lives depended on it!

As I'm writing this, I'm participating in Pastor Yohang's Lenten study on Vices and Virtues. What I'm learning (besides that I like our Pastor's interactive teaching style, hope he teaches another study soon and encourage you to attend too) is that there can be a fine line between the "virtue" and its opposing "vice." We have to know ourselves, and our weaknesses, read God's Word, and get to know His Heart, carefully, in order to follow that fine line as if our lives depend on it, because they do!

Does that sound as intense, and scary as that NCIS scene? Well; Fear not! Don't lose heart! Remember what we just celebrated — as you're reading this. Not only, like those dogs and their handlers are willing to (and some have) did Jesus give up his life as atonement for our sins, but then He ROSE!! He rose so that, even though we will continue to stray from the path; as long as we believe in and "strive" to follow Him, He will continue leading us back! He died, and rose, and continues to forgive because our lives DO depend on it!

A committee was established called the Building Committee. For many years, the Committee met, added and lost members, tried to help us to get going on the building project, but nothing happened. They tried hard, but we spent a lot of time on the “we can’t afford it route.”

As the time passed, interest generally started picking up a bit. Around 2000, a serious Building Fund was started and donations began to come in, but we were a long, long way from what we would need. Then, around 2004, discussions started getting serious and we were on our way . . .

As plans continued, expenses started and funds grew. We raised the first \$1 million before construction started. Before long it was obvious that God must have wanted us to do this – the signs were everywhere (*no, not the crowded office or sanctuary*):

- Bids came in less than we anticipated.
- The weather that winter was one of the warmest in Rochester history.
- Despite being turned down by nearly every bank in town (we applied to many places) – we found another way by selling bonds.
- With some additions, etc., we were going to run about \$250,000 short. But, Glen Ide — without knowing this — decided to donate \$300,000 to the Fund. That’s how the Ide Center came to be named.

Fast forward to today – we are down to 29 months of mortgage left, owing just under \$200,000!! AND – what we have achieved has just been amazing.

We are asking everyone to help us get closer to our ‘Debt Free’ day! What a celebration that will be! This benefits all of us. Imagine the possibilities of a future without a mortgage payment!




United Women in Faith

Reading Circle – April 11th at 1:30 PM

Feel free to join us. We will be discussing — *The Stranger in the Lifeboat* by Mitch Albom, a #1 New York Times Bestseller.

What would happen if we called on God for help and God actually appeared? In Mitch Albom's profound new novel of hope and faith, a group of shipwrecked passengers pull a strange man from the sea. He claims to be "the Lord." And he says he can only save them if they all believe in him.

Adrift in a raft after a deadly ship explosion, ten people struggle for survival at sea. Three days pass. Short on water, food and hope, they spot a man floating in the waves. They pull him in.



"Thank the Lord we found you," a passenger says.

"I am the Lord," the man whispers.

In *The Stranger in the Lifeboat*, Albom keeps us guessing until the end: Is this strange man really who he claims to be? What actually happened to cause the explosion? Are the survivors in heaven, or are they in hell? The story is narrated by Benji, one of the passen-

gers, who recounts the events in a notebook that is discovered—a year later—when the empty life raft washes up on the island of Montserrat. It falls to the island's chief inspector, Jarty LeFleur, a man battling his own demons, to solve the mystery of what really happened.

A fast-paced, compelling novel that makes you ponder your deepest beliefs, *The Stranger in the Lifeboat* suggests that answers to our prayers may be found where we least expect them.
